

## TRAFFIC SAFETY EDUCATION

The district may provide traffic safety instruction for eligible students. A fee shall be assessed to cover those costs which are not reimbursed by state funds, except that this fee may be waived or reduced for students whose families, by reason of their low income, would have difficulty paying the full fee. The USDA child nutrition program guidelines shall be used to determine qualification for a waiver or reduction.

The board directs the superintendent to implement procedures dealing with program supervision; curriculum development; student enrollment criteria, including but not limited to grade level of student, age of student and enrollment status of student; student progress; and collection and refunding of student fees including provisions for accruing money for future traffic safety program needs or refunding students when student fees exceed the unreimbursed cost of the programs; and notice of the availability of fee waivers or reductions.

### **Traffic Safety Education**

The following procedures shall be in effect:

- A. The superintendent shall designate a staff member in charge of the district's traffic safety education program. The program supervisor shall ensure that the district's traffic safety education program receives annual approval from OSPI.
- B. For instructional purposes, the traffic safety education instructor shall use the district's instructional materials for traffic safety education.
- C. Each student enrolled in a traffic safety program shall meet the objectives and competencies listed in the district curriculum as a condition of successful completion of the program.
- D. Recognizing that the district can serve a limited number of students each year, certain enrollment criteria are established. Students enrolled in private schools, home schooled children and students who have received a certificate of educational competence (GED) shall have equal access to enroll as part-time students. Enrollment criteria in descending order of priority are (a) grade level in school (12<sup>th</sup> grade – highest), (b) date and time of registration.
- E. Students must have a valid driver's permit on the first day of class or within seven days of the first class. Students enrolled in traffic safety during the regular school year must reside in the district or be students who have been released by another district to attend school or be registered for home schooling in this district
- F. The fee for traffic safety education will be set by the district. Each student will be required to pay the established fee at the time of enrollment.
- G. Students who have attended more than 50% of the program's scheduled classes and have completed at least 90% of the program's objectives, but have not completed all program objectives, shall receive an "incomplete" and shall be provided an opportunity to achieve successfully all objectives during the current school year and ensuing summer. Students failing to do so will receive a failing grade.
- H. Students who receive a failing grade or have dropped from the program shall pay an additional fee when re-entering the program.
