

Anythink York Branch to close on Friday, May 15

Next month, Anythink's York Street branch will be closing its doors and moving to its new location, 2211 Eppinger Blvd – just four blocks north of the Skyview Campus. While we are sad to see the library go, we are looking forward to visiting <u>Anythink's new building</u> and enjoying many new experiences, opportunities, classes, and of course, books. The new Anythink building is scheduled to open in October 2024. Library services will be provided via Bookmobile at Thornton Community Park throughout the summer and into the fall.

Anythink York Street will close permanently at 5 p.m. Friday, May 17. This means after Friday, May 17, students, staff, and community members will no longer be able to visit the Anythink Library on the Skyview Campus and the building will be closed.

If your child currently goes to Anythink York Street after school, this will no longer be an option after Friday, May 17. Please make plans to ensure your child is picked up from school right after the bell. There is no after-school care or supervision on the Skyview Campus once school is released for the day. Attendance Matters - How Mapleton schools are making every day count

When Edgar Torres started at Academy High School as its new school director in 2022, he was shocked at how low its average daily attendance (ADA) was the previous year, hovering at about 79-80 percent. He acknowledged part of the problem was the country as a whole was still recovering from the pandemic and families were readjusting, but he knew things had to change.

"Plenty of studies show that if you come to school, you're more likely to get higher grades, or pass, or receive credits," he said. "And students need credits to walk across the stage at the end of their senior year. That's the most important thing."

In November, Mapleton's Board of Education voted unanimously to approve a <u>new Student</u> <u>Attendance and Chronic Absenteeism policy, JH/JHB</u>. The new policy, <u>available here</u>, combines policy JH, Student Absences and Excuses, and policy JHB, Truancy, and outlines Mapleton's structured approach to promoting school attendance and combating chronic absenteeism.

The revised policy affirms Mapleton's unwavering commitment to consistent school attendance. Through early detection, parent/guardian collaboration, strategic interventions, and a commitment to providing resources necessary to support regular attendance, Mapleton seeks to achieve the highest possible attendance rates, ensuring that all students have equitable access to the educational opportunities affording to them.

Summer Electronic Benefit Transfer (S-EBT) Program

Summer EBT helps families buy food during the summer months. If you qualify, you will get \$40 per child for each month when school is not in session. This amounts to up to \$120 per child. You'll receive a card pre-loaded with money in the mail.

You are eligible if...

- You already participate in SNAP, TANF or Medicaid
- Your child attends a school that offers the National School Lunch or School Breakfast program, and you qualify based on income.

How can you receive benefits?

- Make sure your school has a meal benefits form or household income application on file.
- Make sure your school has your current address and parent/guardian information.

Your family will automatically qualify if you participate in SNAP, TANF or Medicaid. EBT cards will be mailed by the Colorado Department of Human Services. For more information on student eligibility and common questions, visit the <u>Colorado Department of Human Services webpage</u>.
