### **Please Be Aware!**

The College Board is shifting to a completely Digital Administration of exams

#### What's staying the same?

- The digital SAT Suite will continue to measure the knowledge and skills that matter most for college and career readiness
- The **digital SAT** will still be scored on a **1600 scale**, and no concordance is required with the current paper and pencil exam
- The **digital SAT** will still be **administered** in a **school** or in a **test center** with a proctor present (not at home)
- Students will still have free, world-class practice resources on Khan Academy
- Students will **continue** to connect directly to scholarships and **College Board National Recognition Programs**
- The College Board will **continue to support** all students, including those who **receive accommodations** on test day

### **Please Be Aware!**

The College Board is shifting to a completely Digital Administration of exams

### What's changing?

- Students will take the SAT Suite assessments on a laptop or tablet. If students do not have a device, one will be provided on test day
- Each assessment in the SAT Suite will be shorter total test time will be about two hours instead of three
- Students and educators will receive scores faster in **days**, not **weeks**
- **Calculators** will be allowed on the **entire** math section
- Score reports from the SAT Suite will connect students to more relevant information, including topics such as two-year colleges and career and workforce training programs
- The digital SAT Suite will be more secure and flexible. **Each student** will get a **unique version** of the test.



- Practice Exam for All Student Taking the SAT
- It will be administered Fully Online!
- Students will be able to use their own personal device or be provided with a school device to take the exam
- All Juniors Must! This will qualify them for the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test
- Diagnostic Exam with Detailed Score Report
- Evidence-Based Reading, Writing and Language, and Math Sections

## The ACT

### ACT (ACT.org)

- English, Math, Reading, Science
- Each Section is Scaled from 1- 36 points
- Total ACT is an Average of the Section Scores (also scaled from 1-36)



# (Un)Necessary Evil Testing Process

### Continued

- Students may take the SAT and ACT
- Colleges will take the best scores from multiple test dates that the student submits
- It is the student's responsibility to request official test scores from SAT/ACT
- There is a growing trend of test-optional schools (fairtest.org)
