



Enrich Basics for Teachers

Get Started Using Enrich...Three Simple Steps

1 Step **ONE**: Where is it?

Enrich (formerly known as TestView) is located at <https://richland1.enrichcloudsc.com>.

2 Step **TWO**: How do I get in?

You need to use the username (generally firstname.lastname) and password that allow you to login to your district computer.

IF you are denied access: If you are an administrator, you may be denied access the first time you attempt to open Enrich. This can be resolved as soon as your rights are assigned by the AARE Office. Please contact our office at 231-7450.

WHEN you sign in: When you sign into Enrich, you are signing an electronic contract stating that you will use the program for educational and business purposes only. Violation of this statement is grounds for reprimand.

WHEN you sign out: Please make sure to sign out of Enrich when you are done. The information in the system is confidential and leaving the application open may permit others to see information they are not privy to.

3 Step **THREE**: What will I be able to see?

Enrich integrates standardized test score data with demographic, class, and teacher data. Users at the district, school, and classroom levels now have a tool that tracks, charts, and manages performance data!

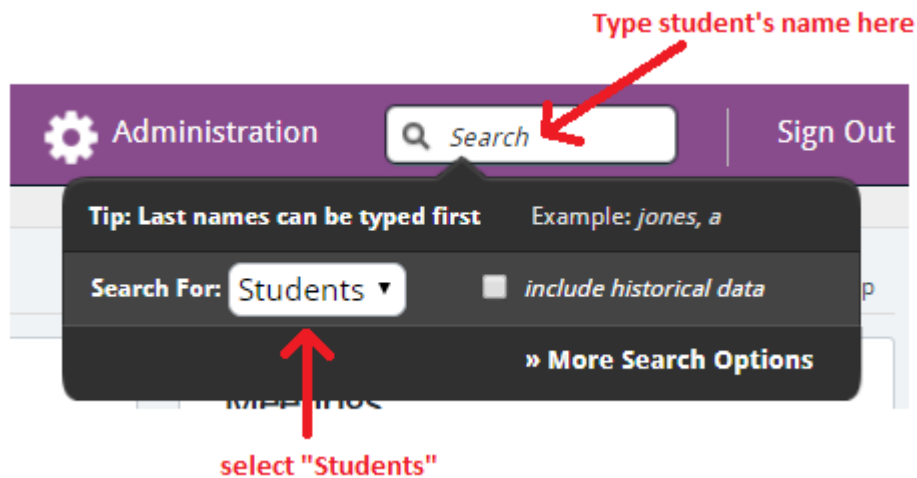
TEACHER Role: Users with teacher-level permission will be able to access his/her students from the current and previous roster years.

Four Pillars of TestView for Teacher Level

Pillar ONE: Search

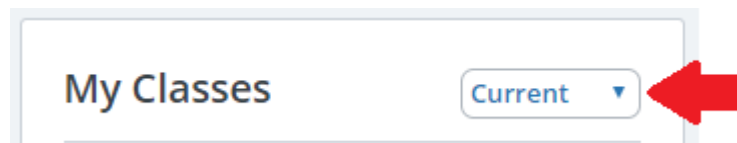
This is the easiest and most intuitive portion of Enrich. You can search for any student that you have permission to view. (Note: you do not have to enter an entire name for this feature to work. You may enter the first few letters of a last or first name if you are unsure of the spelling). **In this section, you can view the student's a) profile, b) test scores and c) transcripts.**

Search for a student by typing a portion of the student's name into the search bar in the top right corner. Make sure that you have select "Student" from the drop-down menu (circled below).

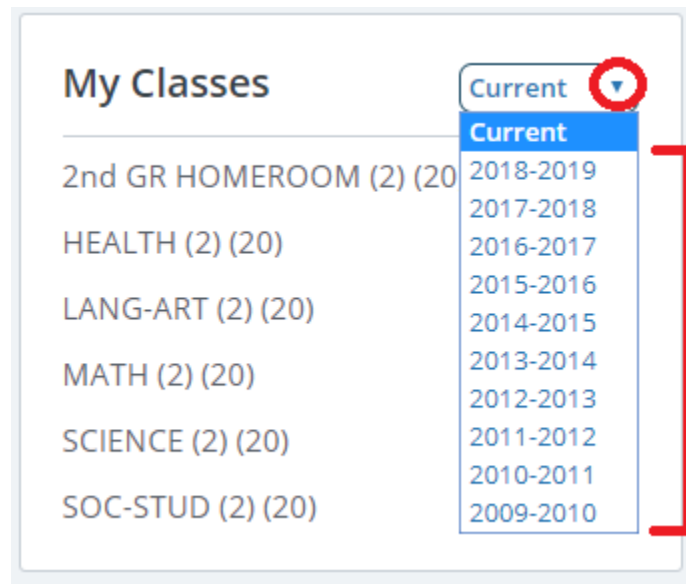


Pillar TWO: Courses

VIEW Current Courses: This will allow you to see students that are currently assigned to you in PowerSchool. Once PowerSchool rolls over in July and classes are assigned to you, it would be a great time to start looking at test scores of students that you will have in the coming year.

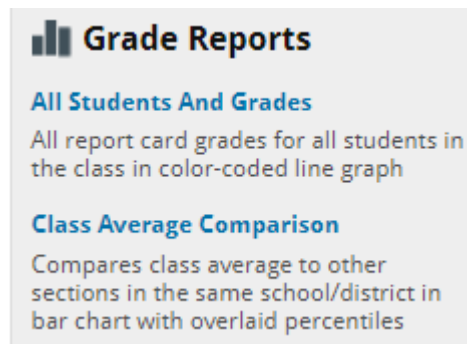


VIEW Previous Courses: Clicking on previous courses will allow you to see students that were assigned to you in PowerSchool last year. This would be a great way to see how your students from last year scored on end of the year assessments (PASS, EOCEP, etc.).

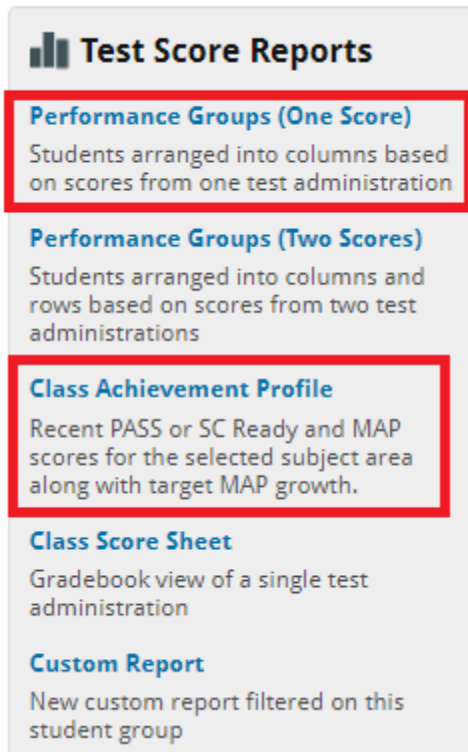
GRADES: You can see grades for a particular course displayed two ways: **All Students and Grades** or **Class Average Comparison**

TEST SCORES: You can see scores for a particular course. There are two important reports to examine. The first **Performance Groups (One Score)** will allow you to select criteria of a class and the scores you wish to see. The second is the **Class Achievement Profile (CAP)** which if the course is ELA, Math, Science or Social Studies, will allow you to see the classes assessment scores and final course grade compared to one another.

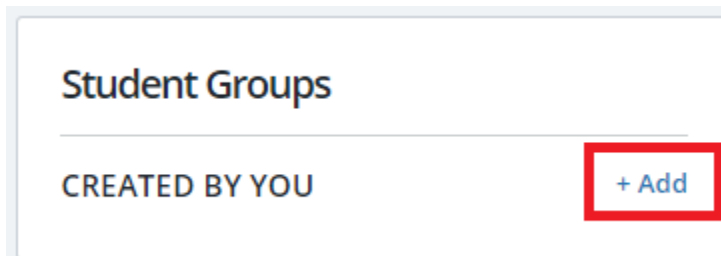


Test Score Reports

- Performance Groups (One Score)**
Students arranged into columns based on scores from one test administration
- Performance Groups (Two Scores)**
Students arranged into columns and rows based on scores from two test administrations
- Class Achievement Profile**
Recent PASS or SC Ready and MAP scores for the selected subject area along with target MAP growth.
- Class Score Sheet**
Gradebook view of a single test administration
- Custom Report**
New custom report filtered on this student group

Pillar **THREE**: Student Groups

CREATE A Group: You can create groups of students in Enrich by clicking “Add” from the “Student Groups” box on your home page.

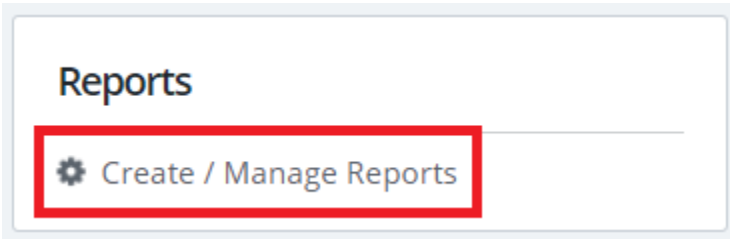

For example, if you are tutoring a group of students in your class after school, you could create a group called “After School Math Tutoring” to monitor their assessment scores.


USE a Group Filter: Creating these groups will allow you to select them in the reports section when you are running reports. For example, you can create a report to see 9th grade EOCEP English 1 scores for the group “9th grade Basketball Players”.

Pillar **FOUR**: Reports

To create a report in Enrich, click on “Create/Manage Reports” from the “Reports” box on your home screen.



On the next screen, select “Assessments” as the Category and click on the “+” sign beside “New Blank Report” to display your report template options. Click on “Test Score Details.”

Test Score Details

Detailed results of student assessments. Useful for longitudinal assessment analysis.

[Test Score Distribution](#)

Frequency distribution of student test scores. Can be used to analyze student achievement in aggregate. Data can also be disaggregated into more specific groupings, such as ethnicity and gender, which is useful for AYP reporting.

To filter by course, select “Class” from the drop-down menu. Then select the Roster Year, School and Teacher. Courses that were taught by the teacher at the corresponding school during the roster year selected will appear in a list. Check the box beside the courses you would like to retrieve scores for.

Click “Add Test Administration” to add the assessment information you are seeking. Select “District/State/National” from the first drop-down. Then select the assessment name. Select the year or administration season from the “Administration” drop-down.

Scroll through the options listed and select the details you would like to appear on the report. Depending on the assessment you may be looking for different items. For example, to determine how the students performed on the English portion of the ACT Aspire assessment, you would select the items below:

You can add multiple assessments or administrations by clicking “Add Test Administration” again from the Report Criteria page. If you decide to add multiple tests or administrations, you can decide whether to include to exclude students who may have only taken one of the assessments by checking or unchecking the box beside “Omit students if they were untested in one or more administrations.”

Once you have added the items you would like to appear on your report, click “Run” at the bottom of the screen.

Now you should see a table with student names and assessment scores listed.

At the top of this page you have a few options:

View Report

 Edit Criteria  Save  Save As...  Print  Export  Add to student group

- **Edit Criteria:** This will allow you to change the information that is displayed on the report (example: if you need to add another assessment or change the variables that are being displayed).
- **Save:** This will save the report in Enrich so that you can reuse the template later. Make sure that the report has a descriptive title before you save it. If you need to change the title click “Edit Criteria.”
- **Print:** This will allow you to send a copy of the report to your printer. Because the tables are often cut off when printed directly from Enrich, this is not the best way to print your report.
- **Export:** This will export the table into Excel. From here you can filter and format the table as you wish (for optimal printing).
