TESTING

Always read the questions first.
This will help you to focus your attention and direct you to the parts of the reading passage that are most important for you to understand.

Make sure you understand exactly what each question is asking. STOP and take a moment to think about what you will need to look for in the reading passage. Sometimes it helps to put the question in your own words or circle key words in the passage.

Be aware that the answer to a question is often stated in words that are a little bit different from the exact words used in the reading passage. This is meant to test your comprehension, not just word recognition skills.
