An analogy is a comparison between two known things to create an understanding of a new concept. It aids in informing the reader about the relationship between two ideas.

As your child becomes familiar with analogies, they will begin to improve their skills in:

## Stem Time

Use prefixes to help decode unfamiliar words and determine word meaning.

**a** = lacking, without, not, on, in, to ---  
amoral

**ab** = away, removed, from ---  
abnormal

**ante** = before, prior to, front --- anterior

**anti** = against, opposite --- antisocial

**auto** = self --- autograph

## FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE

### Simile

A simile is a type of figurative language which is used to compare one thing against another. Similes compare the likeness of two things and often feature the words 'like' or 'as': "As strong as an ox/ As brave as a lion."

### Metaphor

A metaphor is a phrase describing something as something it is not in reality. It is used to compare two things symbolically. A metaphor literally describes something as something it is not. "Love is a battlefield"

### Oxymoron

An oxymoron is a term which features two words which appear to contradict each other but make sense of the situation overall.

- For example: That woman is pretty ugly.

### Hyperbole

A hyperbole is a figure of speech which exaggerates the meaning of a sentence.

- For example: My granddad is as old as time.

## Affixes

Group of letters attach **before** and **after** the root word.

**un+accept+able= unacceptable**

(root word)

### Prefixes

A group of letters placed **before** the root word.

### Suffixes

A group of letters placed **after** the root word.
