Cosmetology

Students prepare to qualify for the state cosmetology licensure examination. Students receive training in the art and science of hair, skin, and nails.

Culinary Arts

Students engage in an industry driven curriculum designed by The Educational Foundation of the National Restaurant Association to teach, test and award industry recognized certificates.

Engineering

Students participate in a variety of PLTW courses which provide transformative learning and hands-on STEM opportunities.

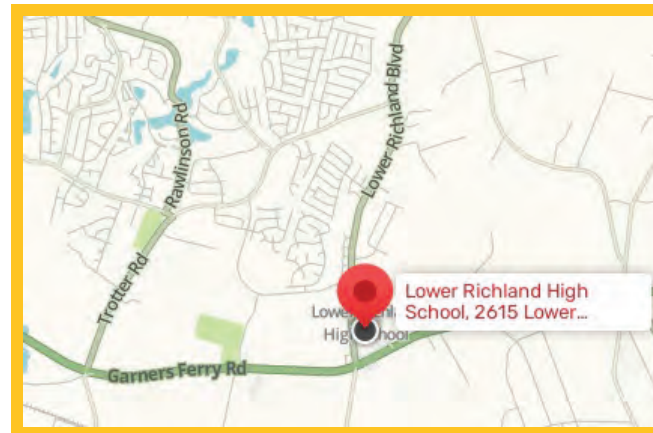

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Lower Richland Academic Opportunities

Lower Richland High School, through innovative learning experiences, will develop inquiring, knowledgeable, and caring students who will promote a better more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.

Advanced Placement

Advanced Placement classes give students an opportunity to take college-level courses and exams while still in high school preparing for serious academic work.

Arts

Students receive quality comprehensive arts education in dance, orchestra, band, chorus, visual arts, and theatre.

Dual Enrollment

Dual enrollment offers eligible high school students the opportunity to enroll in college coursework to earn both high school and college credit from technical and community colleges.

International Baccalaureate Middle Years

IB Middle Years provides students aged 11 to 16, a framework of academic challenge that encourages students to embrace and understand the connections between traditional subjects and the real world, and become critical and reflective thinkers.

International Baccalaureate Diploma

IB Diploma provides students aged 16-19, an academically challenging and balanced programme of education with final examinations that prepares students to earn college credit, and success at university and beyond.

International Baccalaureate Career

IB Career incorporates the vision and educational principles of the IB Programmes into a unique offering specifically designed for students who wish to engage in career-related learning at age 16-19. IB CP is supported by our career and technology education program.
