Current seniors, with rolling admissions it's not too late to start your maritime education and career! You can be a part of America's premiere private, co-educational two-year maritime college offering students the opportunity to pursue maritime education and career-oriented maritime training through our degree program and then continue

through our professional maritime training and STCW training courses in their division of continuing education.

Northeast Maritime Institute has been training professional mariners since 1981 and is the nation's first private maritime college in the United States. Advance both personally and professionally as skilled mariners in either the United States Coast Guard, the United States Merchant Marine or both through a Coast Guard Reserve enlistment while working as Merchant Mariners. A distinct advantage for NMI graduating students, who wish to enlist in the Coast Guard, is that they can have the opportunity to enlist at the Boatswain, 3rd Class level.

A fully accredited school, their associate degree includes four residential semesters and two summer semester co-operative externships onboard commercial vessels. These co-ops provide real world experience and opportunities to build professional relationships in the industry, while accumulating enough sea time for their master license upon graduation. Students at NMI have interned at over 20+ companies in the US. They also have great success placing graduates into the industry, with a near 100% job placement rate after graduation.

Graduates leave the program with 78 credits of general education and nautical science courses as well as completion of the required professional licensing examinations on campus.

NMI graduates are qualifying for the following credentials after completing the two-year college program.

- Master of 100 Gross Ton Near Coastal / Mate of 200 Gross Ton Near Coastal /Able Seaman
- STCW Basic Safety Training /Assistance Towing /Proficiency in Survival Craft /Radar Observer (Unlimited)
- Auxiliary Sail /ECDIS /Automatic Radar Plotting Aids (ARPA) /Tankerman Barge PIC / RFPNW
