Objectives

The objectives of the Parent Support and Information Center are to:

- Ensure effective communication between parents/legal guardians and school personnel for the benefit of students with disabilities;
- Clarify the role of parents, as well as educators, related to special education services;
- Serve as a resource for disability related referrals;
- Provide services that will strengthen the bond between home, school and the community; and
- Foster a rapport between the families of students with disabilities and their schools.

Child Find Services

Each local school division is responsible for providing a *Child Find* program that helps to identify children, ages 2 through 21 years old, residing in its jurisdiction who may qualify for special education services. For preschool children (ages 2-5 years), VBCPS provides screening through the Preschool Assessment Center (PAC) located at the Plaza Annex-FACE Center. Parents/ legal guardians who feel their child's cognitive, fine and gross motor, self-help, social or speech skills may be significantly delayed may call the PAC at (757) 263-2800 for an appointment to meet with the center's interdisciplinary team. If your child is currently attending school, please contact his/her assistant principal to discuss a referral for special education services. If you would like more information about the *Child Find* program please contact the Parent Support and Information Center at (757) 263-2066.

Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE)

The school division's special education and preschool programs are provided free of charge, and their services and resources are designed to assist and support individuals with a variety of disabilities. Disability categories include:

- Autism
- Deaf-Blindness
- Deafness
- Developmental Delay
- Emotional Disability
- Hearing Impairment
- Intellectual Disability
- Multiple Disabilities
- Orthopedic Impairment
- Other Health Impairment
- Specific Learning Disability
- Speech or Language Impairment
- Traumatic Brain Injury
- Visual Impairment including Blindness

If a student is found eligible to receive special education services, an individualized education program (IEP) is written to outline the specially designed instruction, related services, and supplemental aids and services necessary to meet the student's educational needs. The parent/legal guardian is a member of the committee that writes the IEP, and his/her involvement in the development process is welcome and encouraged.
