

# Battle of the Java Sea By Laphis M

In 1942, a Japanese amphibious naval force preparing to invade the Dutch East Indies island of Java was intercepted by the main allied naval force under the command of Dutch Rear-Admiral Karel Doorman consisting of two heavy cruisers (HMS Exeter and USS Houston), three light cruisers (Doorman's flagship HNLMS De Ruyter, HNLMS Java, HMAS Perth), and nine destroyers. The Japanese task force defending the convoy

commanded by
Rear-Admiral Takeo
Takagi consisted of
two heavy cruisers
(Nachi and Haguro)
and two light cruisers
(Naka and Jintsu), and
14 destroyers
including the 4th



Destroyer Squadron under the command of Rear Admiral Shoji Nishimura. The Japanese heavy cruisers were much more powerful, armed with ten 8 inch guns (203 mm) guns each and superior torpedoes and by comparison, HMS Exeter was armed only with six 8 inch guns and only six of USS Houston 8 inch guns were operable after her aft turret was knocked out in a earlier air attack.

The battle was a series of attempts over a seven hour period by Doorman's task force to attack the invasion force, each attempt was pushed back by the escort force, causing massive damage to the allied forces.

When the battle began, both sides showed poor gunnery and torpedo skills, missing multiple times until HMS Exeter was critically damaged by a hit in the boiler room by a 8 inch shell and retreated back to Surabaya, escorted by a destroyer. Then the Japanese launched two massive torpedo salvos, consisting of 92 torpedoes in all, but scored only one hit, on the destroyer HNLMS Kortenaer, which almost instantly broke in half and sank. The destroyer HMS Electra- covering the crippled Exeter, engaged in a duel with Jintsu and the destroyer Asagumo,

scoring several hits and causing Asagumo to retire, but was completely crippled and out of ammo, abandoned ship was ordered. Eventually, the Allied fleet broke off and



turned away and shortly after, lost HMS Jupiter to a mine. Shortly after, at night, the fleet encountered Japanese escort group again and exchanged fire until De Ruyter and Java were sunk by one devastating torpedo salvo, killing Doorman

and most of the crew. The surviving ships, low on ammo and fuel, all retired and escaped.

On March 1, in two separate battles, the Exeter, Perth, and Houston and several other destroyers were found and sunk by the Japanese. The result of the battle was disastrous. The main allied naval force had been almost totally destroyed: 10 ships and approximately 2,173 sailors were lost. The battle ended all significant Allied naval operations in Southeast Asia in 1942, Japanese land forces successfully invaded Java, and the Dutch surface fleet was practically eradicated from Asian waters, and all Allied forces retreated to Australia shortly after. The last Allied forces surrendered on March 9.

the lead and seizing control of the game. They also are averaging 38.9 percent as a team beyond the



arc. Frank Vogel the head coach of the Lakers has been stressing ball movement and making the extra pass to create open looks. Despite the loss of rim protectors in JaVale McGee and Howard, the Lakers have done a decent job forcing opponents to take tough shots. The Lakers have averaged 48 rebounds per game on the road compared to 46 per game at home.

However, things have not been smooth sailing for the Lakers. They lost to the Los Angeles Clippers, Portland Trailblazers, Golden State Warriors and San Antonio Spurs at home. With most arenas are not having fans visiting due to the COVID-19 pandemic, home-court advantage has been a wash, other than visiting teams having to travel and adhere to strict NBA safety protocols on the road.

Led by Lebron James, Vogel has done a nice job of making a selfless environment where players don't have to worry about individual statistics and are willing to sacrifice for the great good of the team. Vogel said that this is the deepest team that he can remember and judging by the way L.A.'s bench has paid, he appears right. Despite being listed with a left ankle sprain earlier this year, Lebrun James has not missed a game, averaging 32.7 minutes a contest, just two minutes less than the 34.6 minutes per game he averaged last year.









## My Paintings
