The image of Stone Cold Steve Austin was digitally altered into the original image and then shared recently with the false claim that the President had been assassinated. 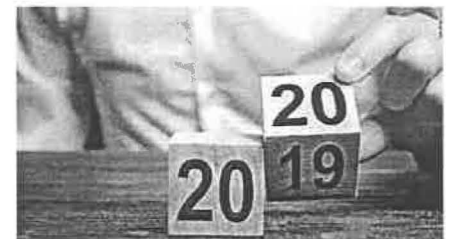

Disappearing Birds

In September of 2019 scientists have discovered that almost 2.9 billion birds have died in North America since 1970. Surprisingly, rare and exotic birds aren't the ones disappearing, but instead it's the more common ones like sparrows and blackbirds. Organizations like the U.S. Geological Survey and the Canadian Wildlife Services are helping to collect the data to see how we can help save these animals. Over 400 different types of



birds have lost some of their kind, the most common one being the grassland bird, which lost more than 700 million of its kind in the last 50 years. According to the Smithsonian's Migratory Bird Center, planting new plants and trees in your backyard can help save these birds, because it can help the birds have a better food source from the fruit that grows or from the insects on the plants. Australians Drop Food, Save Wildlife

Did you know that the Australian government is using air crafts to help feed starving animals because of the wildfire? Well they dropped more than 4,000 pounds of food like carrots and sweet potatoes to colonies of brush tailed rock-wallabies that were left stranded as wildfires took their homes. The brush-tailed rock-wallabies were already endangered before the fires began, and government officials said their survival could be complicated further. Over a billion animals were killed and fires scorched around 8.4 million hectares (about the size of Maryland.)

Over the last week, nearly 2,000 pounds of sweet potatoes and carrots were sent to colonies in the state's Capertee and Wolgan valleys; 2,000 pounds to areas of Yengo National Park; and about 200 pounds of food and water in the Kangaroo Valley. The drops are one of the most widespread relief efforts of their kind for brush-tailed rock-wallabies. It's to help maintain the animal colonies and allow them to recover. The food given is for the recovery of endangered species like the Brush-tailed Rock-wallaby, the wallabies survived the fire itself, but are left stranded with limited food since the fire took the vegetation around their rocky habitat.



But the fire did not only take that, it also took the lives of 25 people and destroyed about 2,000 homes. A billion animals have been killed since fires began in early September, and 800 million in New South Wales alone. Fire seasons regularly take place in the country, but this year has been devastating. They experienced one of the hottest and driest years, because of the Indian Ocean. IOD was in its strongest positive phase, which led to cooler sea temperatures near Australia and less rain for the country. Australians are doubtful that wildlife will fully recover. There is nothing to compare with what is going on. It's a monstrous event in terms of geography and number of animals affected. Over the last several decades, Australia has had the highest rate of extinction for mammals, and things like this hastens the extinction process for other species, so it's a sad time.

U.S. vs Iran?
