<u>Disney Ordered To Drop Trademark</u> <u>"Hakuna Matata"</u>

"The Lion King" is a Disney classic with many songs in the movie, but as of recently due to the remake of the movie an online petition urges Disney to drop its trademark of the phrase "Hakuna Matata" a song about having no worries. The Swahili phrase, "hakuna matata" which is what the online petition is about,

has garnered about 57,000 signatures as of December 19th. The online petition states that many African countries such as Burundi and Uganda have been using the phrase for a long time. "So Disney can't be allowed to trademark something that it didn't invent" the petition says. The trademark was brought to attention due to the remake of the movie starring Donald Glover, James Earl Jones and Beyoncé Knowles-Carter.

According to Newsela, this isn't the first time the company has received similar criticism before. The movie "Coco," a Disney and Pixar collaboration, that was originally going to be titled "Dia de las Muertos." Disney then applied for a trademark in 2013 but received backlash so they withdrew the application. This was led by Mexican-American cartoonist Lalo Alcaraz with the rest of the Latino community. Pixar then hired Alcaraz as a cultural advisor for "Coco" and stated "It was wrong to attempt to trademark 'Dia de los Muertos' for commerce, and it is wrong to attempt to trademark 'Hakuna Matata,' too."

Japan Remembers Bombing Victims

Over 500 students at Shiroyama Elementary School in Japan gather in the assembly hall every 9th day of the month to sing a song for fallen victims of the Hiroshima



and Nagasaki bombings. Over seventy years have passed since the bombings killing 1,300 students and 28 staff. Thus, the school feels like they must never forget the victims of the bombings. About 400 schools across Japan visit this site to learn about the students and

teachers whose lives were killed without warning "In a brief flash....expiring meaninglessly." 74 year old Setsuo Uchino was just one year and nine months old when the Nagasaki bombings took place.

"Unfortunately I don't think I will see nuclear weapons eradicated when I'm still alive, but I'm hoping that during the next generation's time something will improve" said Uchino. His mother would have reoccuring dreams of the the bombings. She would see burned people on the street begging for water where the scene was like "Hell on Earth". It may be a strong topic to confront to younger children but they must know about the horrors older generations confronted. For the 73rd anniversary of the bombings Japan will invite world leaders to reflect on what happened that fateful day.

According to CNN, a Milwaukee bus driver spotted a toddler walking alone and about to walk into an open intersection. The child was wearing a red onesie and a diaper. "I'm just grateful I was in the right place at the right time," Ivic said at the commendation ceremony held in her honor on Thursday. The woman who saved her is named Irena Ivic. She stopped the bus and ran to the toddler

moments before the baby crossed the road. She carried the toddler to the bus as the passengers gathered to help the child. "Oh my God. Oh my God. I am shaking," Ivic said.



A passenger on the bus took off her coat to help the little girl become warm; she was cold to the touch. The temperatures that day was freezing. The poor baby was alone and barefoot. It happened December 22, according to the transit system. Ivic comforted the baby by stroking her hair. The little one fell asleep in her arms. The 19-month-old had been cold and hungry, but was otherwise unharmed, police said. The child went missing after officials believe her mother had a mental breakdown the transit system statement said. "Authorities eventually reunited the baby with its father," This was the ninth time a lost or missing child has been found by a Milwaukee County Transit System driver in recent years. "I absolutely love kids. I used to be a teacher and I have children of my own, so I'm so happy I was able to help this sweet, innocent baby," Ivic said. The baby is now with its father.


Dr. Richado Pun-Chong is a doctor undergoing his
