One day he made a dictionary named "Callahan's Generation Z Dictionary" and one of his students posted his dictionary online. Within 24 hours, the tweet received over 300,000 likes and 93,000 retweets. Ever since she posted that tweet she has gained 500 hundred followers. The professor said that the unofficial guide to teenage language breaks up the lesson. The list also gets the students involved and makes them feel in charge of the dictionary.

College Softball World Series

Planning on baking a cake with your friends? My friends and I have decided to bake a boxed party rainbow chip cake by Betty Crocker for this segment of the newspaper. We are going to be taking you along this journey of traditions, baking, and fun times along the way.

Now why did we choose to bake a cake? Cakes are often used as a dessert for celebrations like a famous one many people celebrate, birthdays.

The cake is usually one of the things that brings people together for these types of holidays and is often the main piece. This is why we chose to bake a cake and also why we are baking it with each other because of how it brings people together.



For the recipe you will need:

- 1 Cup Water
- 1/2 Cup Vegetable Oil
- 3 Eggs
- Time to bake!

1. Heat oven to 350°F for shiny metal or glass pan or 325°F for nonstick pan. Grease bottom only of 13"x9" pan or bottom and sides of all other pans.

2. Mix Cake Mix, water, oil and eggs in a large bowl with a mixer on medium speed or beat vigorously by hand for 2 minutes. Pour into the pan.

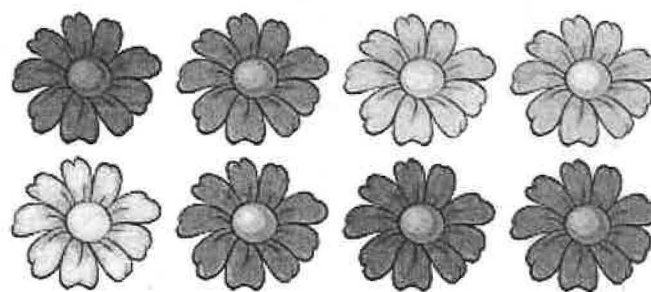
3. Bake as directed in the chart or until the toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes before removing from the pan. Cool completely before frosting.

Pan Size: 13"x9" | Two 8" Rounds | Two 9"Rounds | Bundt® | Cupcakes (makes 24)

Bake Time (in minutes)* : 28-33 | 28-33 | 24-29 | 38-43 | 12-17 Heat oven to 375°F for shiny metal pan or 350°F for nonstick pan. Spoon batter into cups (about 3 Tbsp each).

High Altitude (3500-6500 ft): For all Bundt® pans, heat oven to 325°F; grease and flour pan. Bake 8" rounds 30-35 min. Make 30 cupcakes.

Now that you have made your cake (or cupcakes) you can decorate it and enjoy it with your friends.

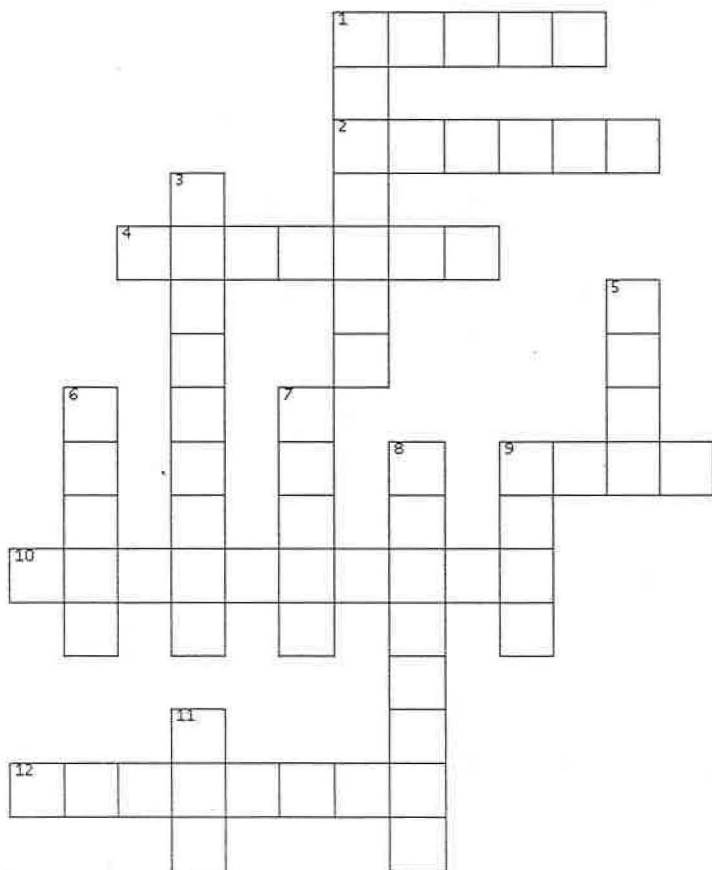
