new places for competitions. At competitions, you answer math problems MATHCOUNTS' individually and on a team that Ms.


Vedernikova picks. Fremont also hosts

Academia. I asked Athena what she likes to do in her freetime and she said she likes to draw anime characters.






with a Disney theme, students and teachers dressed up as Disney characters. A rumor has been going around that there would be a spring dance. We will see... diagnosed with

The government has made it so Silicon Valley can build and deploy thousands of its self-driving delivery vehicles on US streets. California, is now able to launch up to 5,000 of its R2 autonomous vehicles over the next two years. The R2 has no steering wheel, pedals or side mirrors as it's designed to be unmanned and carry cargo. Large compartments on its side so it can Carry things like groceries or pizza. Nuro said the R2 will begin delivering pizza and groceries in Houston this year. It will initially

deploy the R2 in about codes six zip in Houston, so it can cover about 160,000 residents.

The R2 is a low car speed which means it can only go about 25 miles per hour and it can carry



about 2,500 pounds. Normally the Department of Transportation makes it, so vehicles have to have things like seat belts, but this is the first one made by a company to be an exception. In exchange, any crash that happens because of this vehicle is to be reported to the government. The company Nuro is focused more on the transportation of items than actual humans so they can have less safety issues and keep more money.

"A very dark, rich chocolate cookie for the true chocoholic. This recipe uses relatively little flour, resulting in dense, fudge-like cookies. These cookies keep well in the freezer (but you may have a hard time waiting for them to thaw before you eat them)."

Ingredients

4 (1 ounce) squares unsweetened chocolate, chopped 1 cup semisweet chocolate chips 6 tablespoons butter 3 eggs 1 cup white sugar 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract

1/2 cup all-purpose flour 2 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder 1/4 teaspoon baking powder 1/4 teaspoon salt 1 cup semisweet chocolate chips

Directions

- In the microwave or in a metal bowl over a pan of simmering water, melt unsweetened chocolate, 1 cup of the 1 chocolate chips, and the butter stirring occasionally until smooth. Remove from heat and set aside to cool. In a large bowl, whip eggs and sugar until thick and pale, about 2 minutes. Stir in the vanilla and the chocolate mixture until well mixed. Combine the flour, cocoa, baking powder and salt; gradually stir into the chocolate mixture. Fold in remaining 1 cup chocolate chips. Cover dough and chill for at least an hour or overnight.
- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Roll chilled dough into 1 inch balls. Place on ungreased cookie 2 sheets so they are 2 inches apart.
- Bake for 9 to 11 minutes in the preheated oven. Allow cookies to cool on baking sheet for 5 minutes before 3 removing to a wire rack to cool completely.

Pound chicken breasts if they are too thick. Place a cheese and ham slice on each breast within 1/2 inch of the edges. Fold the edges of the chicken over the filling, and secure with toothpicks. Mix the flour and paprika in a small bowl, and coat the chicken pieces.

Heat the butter in a large skillet over medium-high heat, and cook the chicken until browned on all sides. Add the wine and bouillon. Reduce heat to low cover, and simmer for 30 minutes, until chicken is no longer pink and juices run clear.

Remove the toothpicks, and transfer the breasts to a warm platter. Blend the cornstarch with the cream in a small bowl, and whisk slowly into the skillet Cook, stirring until thickened, and pour over the chicken. Serve warm


Glauben wants other people to hear his story and wants to keep people from hating others. His memories are being saved and recorded by the Holocaust Museum.






