Los Angeles Lakers

The Los Angeles Lakers are a basketball team in the NBA. The Los Angeles Lakers franchise has a long and storied history, predating the formation of the National Basketball Association. The team originated in Minneapolis, Minnesota in 1947. Their name changed to Lakers to reflect the Minnesota state nickname, "Land of 10,000

Lakes." They relocated to Los Angeles before the 1960–61 season after struggling financially in the late 1950's following Mike's retirement. They lost every series to the Celtics, but finally made the NBA Finals six times in the 1960s. Darvin Ham is currently the coach of the Los Angeles Lakers. Ham, 48, will



be the 28th head coach in franchise history and the 24th of the Los Angeles era. They had 42 wins and 30 loses last year in 2020-2021. They play at the Crypto.com Arena. It is a multi-purpose arena in Downtown Los Angeles. Some rules in basketball are only five players per team on the court, score more than your opponent to win, score within the shot clock, the offense has five seconds to inbound the ball, and the ball and ball handler must remain inbounds. Players score in basketball by successfully shooting the basketball through the hoop. When they make a basket, teams can earn one, two, or three points per shot.

Ukrainian War "The will to survive"

Beginning February 24, 2022, Russia invaded Ukraine, but not for the first time. Previously they invaded in 2014. At the beginning of the invasion, the death rate was low, but

as of October 16, 2022 the death rate of civilians was 6,306 people and 397 of those were kids; with 9,602 people were injured. Mr. Miller responded, "I'm saddened by the loss of lives and the instability that creates for the western democracy." Russian president Vladimir Putin announced the invasion as a "special military



operation" for the "demilitarization and denazification" of Ukraine. He claims that he wants to reduce Ukraine's army and wants to get rid of Nazism, by bringing them to justice. Ukraine, at one point in time, during the Cold War was a part of Russia, aka the Soviet Union. Ms. Vedernikova said, "The person who is in the presidential office of the



Russian federation, is stubborn. He thinks he can restore the Russian empire." Putin refuses to accept them as a separate country.

At the beginning of the invasion, Russia managed to secure the cities on the Russian-Ukrainian border, Russia captured the cities

Mariupol and Kherson; and on July 3, 2022 they completely captured Luhansk Oblast. They were attacking from neighboring countries that are pro-Russia; Belarus to the north, Crimea to the south and Donetsk to the east.

On February 26th, Russian troops had gotten a hold of a Nuclear power plant, since then it has been in Russian control. Since the beginning of the war, Russia has destroyed 15 Ukrainian airports, leaving Ukraine's small Air Force at mercy to Russia's Air Force, which is the 2nd largest in the world (next to the US). As of March 11 2022, a US official stated that "UKAF still has 56 operational fighter jets...", whereas Russia has about 1,188. On March 16th, Ukraine started to officially fight back against Russia, from then on battles ensued between them, fighting for cities. Ukraine is able to turn Soviet-era military equipment into workable weapons, they also have battle tactics inspired by NATO to 'outfight' the Russians.

Russian soldiers commit several war crimes such as, planned attacks on civilians, the massacres of civilians, raping and torture of women and children, and random attacks on highly populated areas. So far Ukraine is recapturing Russian territory and taking back their land. But now from current updates, 20% of Ukraine is occupied by Russia. This isn't the end of the war, actually it's not even halfway done, there are still years before this war will end and more people are going to have to die before it's over. Mr. Crowell stated, "I believe it's going to end at some point, but not any time soon, maybe for a couple of years. Ultimately Putin would lose because the Ukrainians have tons of support from America and Great Britain, though not anytime soon, but Russia would probably leave because Russia is having a lot of difficulties controlling Ukraine." Everyday the death rate and number of cities captured and overtaken changes, so it is difficult to map out the casualties and cities lost. This isn't over, the war is still going to continue raging until something happens to stop it.

We also asked a couple of students on campus if they knew about the war and how they felt about it. Majority of the students we interviewed did know what the war was about from the news, their parents, teachers, or even social media. All of the students felt sad for the innocent people who lost their lives and believe it's very unfair. All of the students and teachers agreed that Russia was in the wrong for this war. Ms. Estes said, "it's absolutely not necessary because they are not fighting for anything except to try to make Russia better." They invaded a country that didn't want to be invaded which killed and wounded so many innocent civilian lives.

WORLD CUP IS WORLDWIDE




How to Bake Muffins

Many people from around the world love muffins, and you can make them at home! Depending on the brand, the instructions may be different, but here is Betty Crocker's method to muffin mix.


You will need: 1/2 Cup Water or Milk muffin mix

1. Heat oven to 400°F (or 375°F for nonstick pan). Place paper baking cups in 6 regular-size muffin cups (for best results), or grease bottoms only of muffin cups.



3. Bake for 17 to 22 minutes or until light golden brown.

Cool for 5 minutes. Carefully remove from pan. If muffins are not in paper baking cups, run the knife around the sides before removing.
