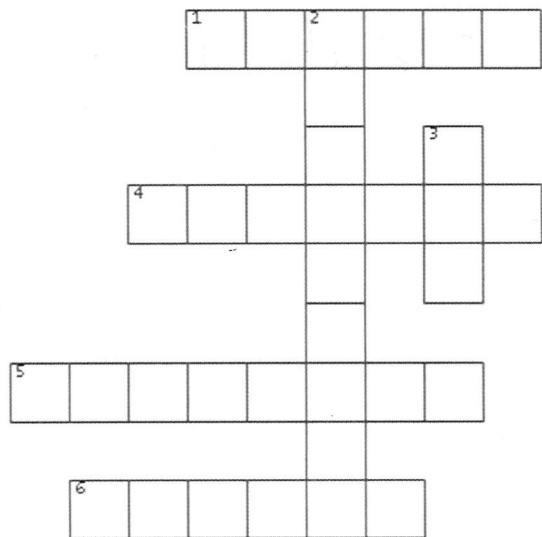
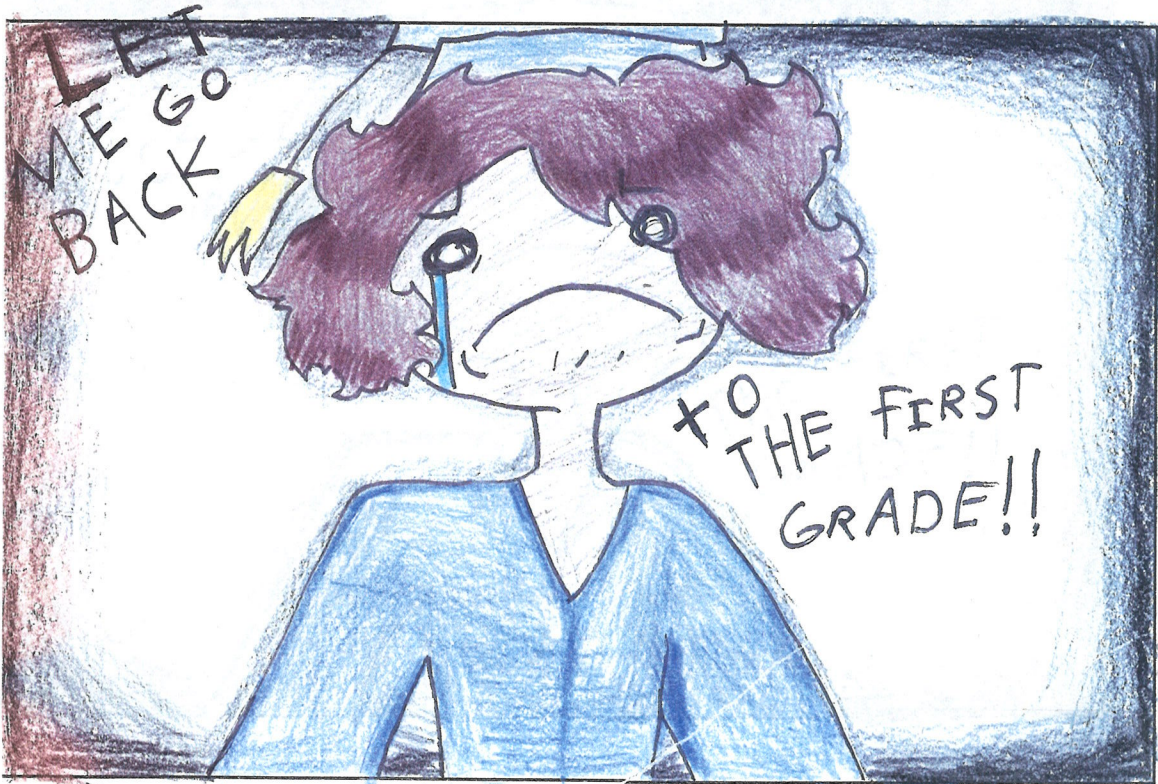
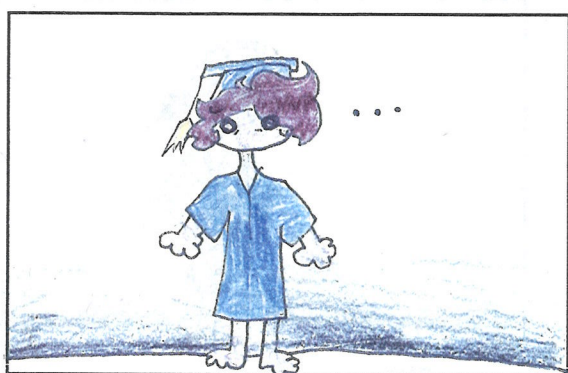
### Returning to Theaters

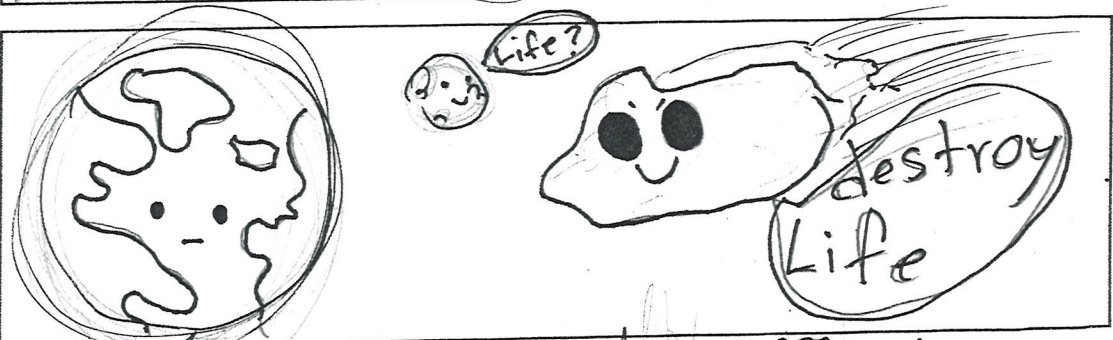
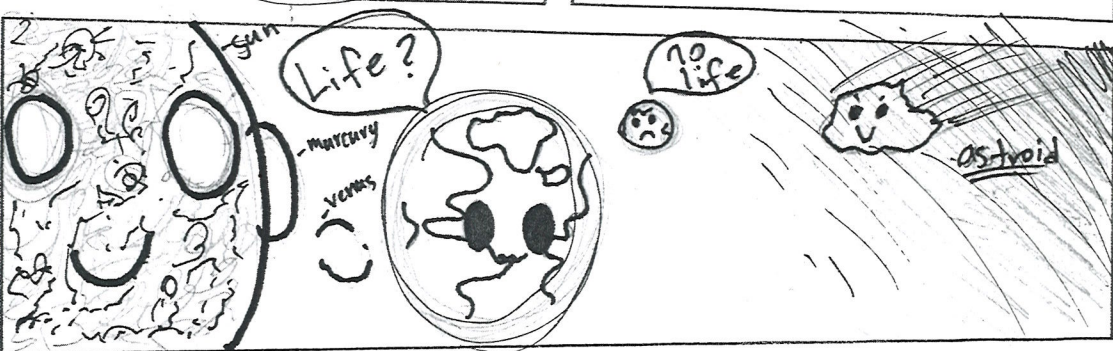
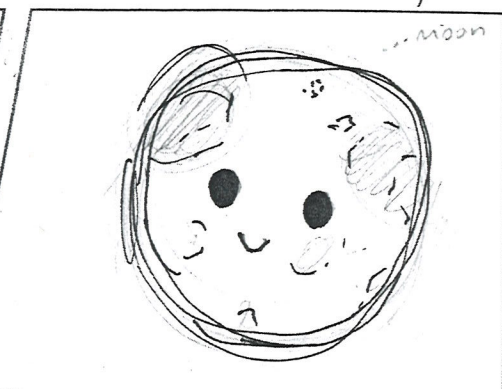
