## The She Believes Cup

On February 18-24, the She Believes Cup took place. It is a yearly 4 team international tournament. The participants of the cup vary each year. This year the United States, Brazil, Canada, and Argentina partook in the tournament. The tournament was held in Orlando, Florida. To win the tournament you must get the most points, you get 3 points for a win, 1 for a tie, and 0 for a loss. If there is a tie-in points, then it is determined by the overall goals scored.



To kick off the tournament, we had Brazil vs Argentina, Brazil took the win with a score of 4-1. That same day we had the United States vs Canada with the United States winning 1-0. 3 days later the United States beat Brazil 2-0, and Canada beat Argentina 1-0. Then a few days later Brazil beat Canada 2-0, and Argentina lost to the United States with the final score being 6-0. ## Which Covid Vaccine?

The Moderna and Pfizer vaccines are the first COVID-19 vaccines authorized by the FDA and recommended by the CDC. It requires 2 shots; when you get the first one you then have to wait between 20 and 28 days to get the other one. The side effects are redness, swelling, tiredness, headache, chills, nausea, and muscle pain but the side effects only last twenty-four to forty-eight hours. The Moderna vaccine is recommended for people aged 18 years and older and Pfizer is for 16 and older. The Moderna vaccine was 94.1% effective at preventing laboratory confirmed covid-19 illness the people who received two doses with no evidence of being infected. Pfizer has similar effectiveness.



The Johnson and Johnson vaccine was 66.3% effective in clinical trials at preventing laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 illness in people who had no evidence of prior infection 2 weeks after receiving the vaccine. People had the most protection 2 weeks after getting vaccinated. The side effects that have been reported with the Johnson COVID-19 Vaccine include injection site reactions: pain, redness of the skin, and swelling and the general side effects: headache, feeling very tired, muscle aches, nausea, fever.

## WEB

Fremont has been fortunate to have Mr. Smathers, Mrs. Todd, Mrs. Farrell, Ms. Padilla, and Mr. Mendez as WEB Coordinators. Their love for the students and school have made WEB a program that has thrived, even during a pandemic.

Also WEB is not a class. WEB is a group of 8th grade volunteers who want to be mentors for the 6th graders. WEB leaders remember what was like to be a 6th grader and want to help the 6th graders feel welcome to a new school. WEB Leaders usually meet during an Advisory class. However, this year they did not have an Advisory class, so the WEB Leaders met on zoom every Wednesday at 2pm and with the 6th graders twice a month on Wednesdays at 9am. 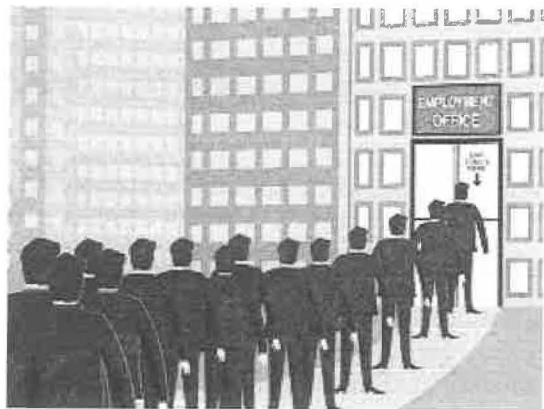

sharing to presently featuring users stories for 24 hours. It also allows users to keep photos in my eyes only which lets them

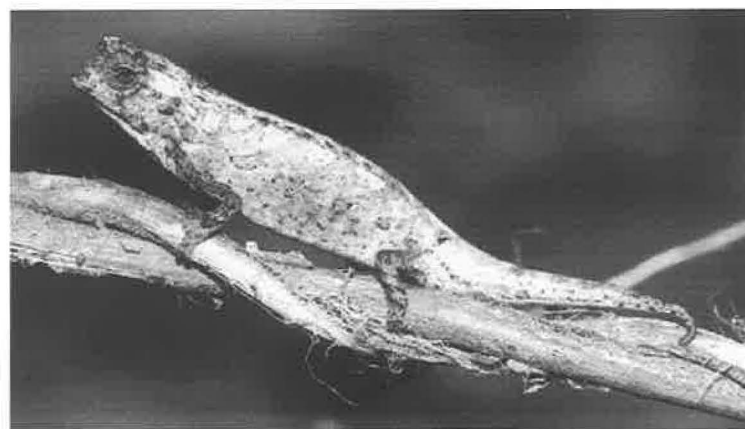


keep their photos in a password protected space.

The app was relaunched as Snapchat in september 2011, Brown settled with Murphy for \$157.5 million and was credited as one of the original authors of Snapchat. The name Snapchat is a reference to the ghostly hero from Shakespeare's play Macbeth, a character in the play who is ultimately seen to be victorious over evil. Also in June 2013, Snapchat introduced Snapkidz for users under 13 years of age.

## World's Smallest Reptile?

According to CNN, a chameleon less than an inch long has been newly discovered. Researchers think it could be the world's smallest reptile. It's called *Brookesia nana* or "nano chameleon" and is blotchy brown and not longer than an inch in body length. Unlike other vertebrates and chameleon species it doesn't change color and would rather be on the forest floor than in the trees. Researchers found the nano chameleon in Madagascar while looking to find a new species.

Most vertebrates grow as they get older while the nano chameleon stays small as an adult. Female nano chameleons are larger than the males. There are at least 13 other species in the *Brookesia* group, but are closer to two inches in length. According to researchers Glaw and Hawlitschek, they think the nano chameleon is critically endangered due to deforestation in the Sorata region of Madagascar. Madagascar officials established a reserve to protect forest habitats that survived deforestation and the species that live there.



## Review Of FLCL

FLCL, (pronounced in English as Fooly Cooly) is a six episode anime series which originally debuted in the United States on August 2003. The story revolves around Naota, a 12-year-old boy. His simple life living in the city of Mabase is interrupted when a Vespa-riding maniac named Haruko Haruhara when she runs him over, then revives him with CPR, before hitting him on the head with her left handed vintage electric guitar.



The first thing I'll mention is the animation. It's amazing for a show made two decades ago. The visual style is all over the place, almost experimental in a good way, it goes from a basic looking, kinda sketchy but fast pace and well detailed to having Matrix style 3D slow motion effects, looking like a comic or a water painting sketch and South Park for some scenes. Despite its experimental nature, the animation blends incredibly well with the story.

The overarching story, which I won't spoil is relatively simple, but hard to understand due to how ridiculous the show gets which is completely fine because it barely matters, except to add context to some of the characters actions. Fooly Cooly, even though the story is simple, it has a lot of symbolism and themes, which I also won't explain.



The soundtrack, made entirely by the rock band The Pillows, who made several albums just for FLCL is incredible (especially since I prefer rock). The songs matched perfectly with each scene and the animation. This also made FLCL more unique because most anime use pop.

I recommend FLCL mostly because it's funny, oddly serious, very action packed, almost like a John Woo movie (they even mention this fact after the credits), has some very good themes about life and just fun to watch.

You can watch the whole series dubbed (the dub is actually even funnier than the original Japanese) on YouTube or Hulu. FLCL does have two sequels, FLCL Progressive and Alternative made two years ago, but they are inferior in every way to the original. Watch if you want.

## Trouble For Tokyo's 2020 Olympics

Those yellow peppers next to the ketchup pump which are delicious, you can order them sliced up inside the burger.

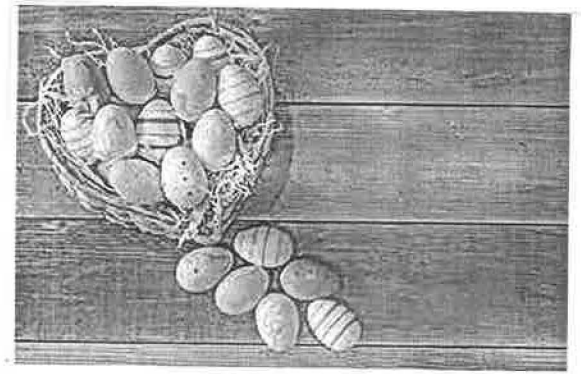
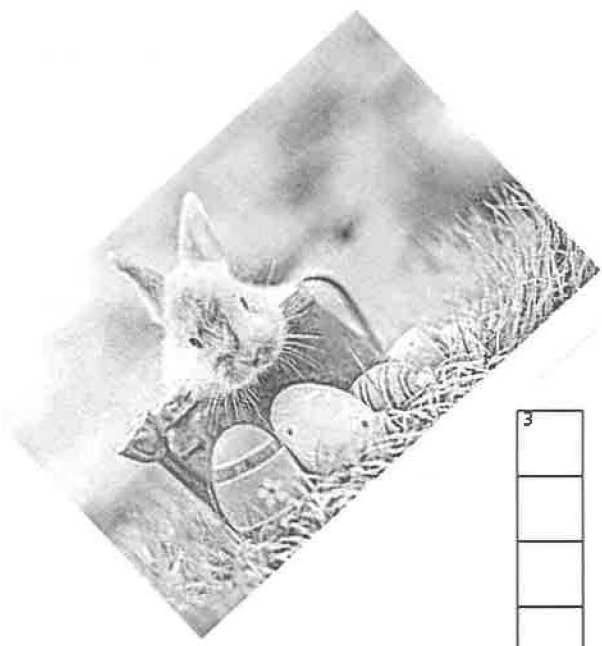


## Everything Everything Book Recommendation

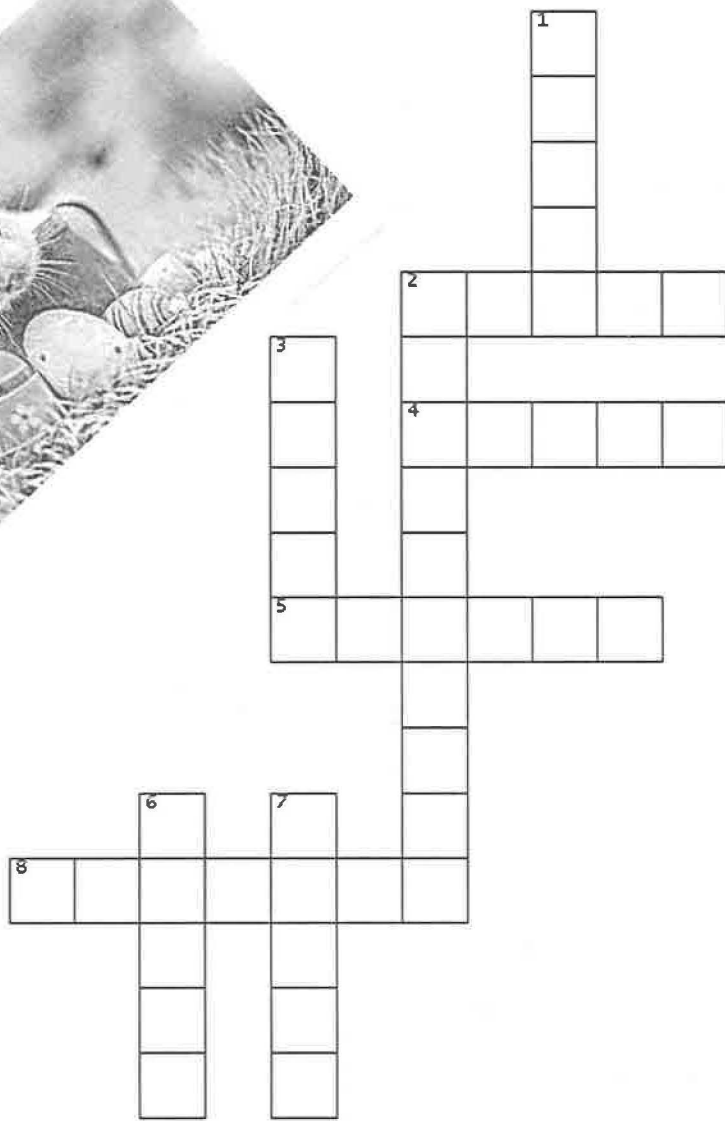
