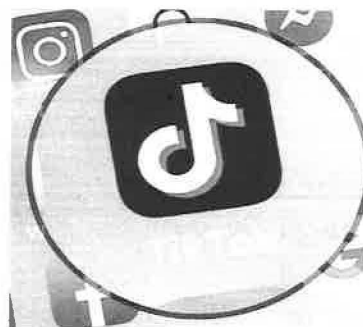


## TikTok Time Limit

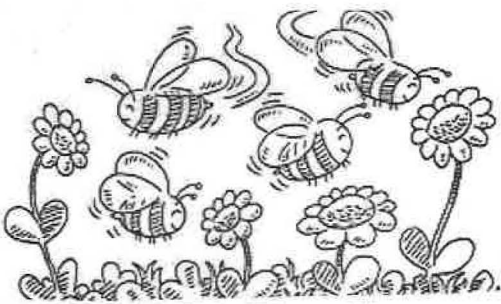
## Bees Teach Baby Bees To Dance

## NBA Playoffs

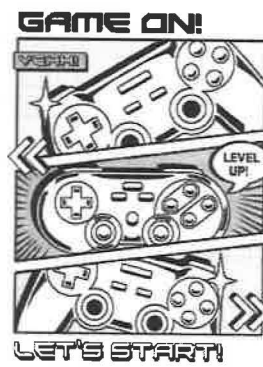

However, what some consider the first video game was made less than 70 years ago. This game, called Tennis For Two, was created by physicist William Higinbotham during October of 1958. It bears much resemblance to the video game Pong which was made in the 70's. However, there were computer programs from earlier in the decade that could be considered video games, such as Bertie the Brain (1950) and Nimrod (1951). Bertie the Brain allowed you to play tic-tac-toe, while Nimrod was meant for a game called Nim, which involved pressing buttons which corresponded to lights.

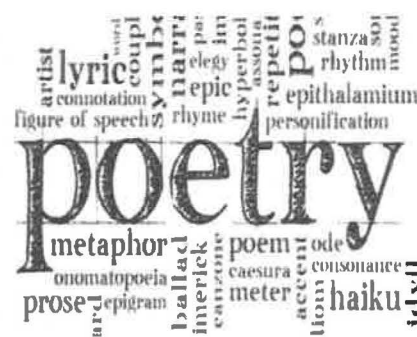


have a proper date of when it's going to come out. AI generated images have been taking over the internet over the past few months. Some parents don't agree with this update because they don't think it's safe for their children.

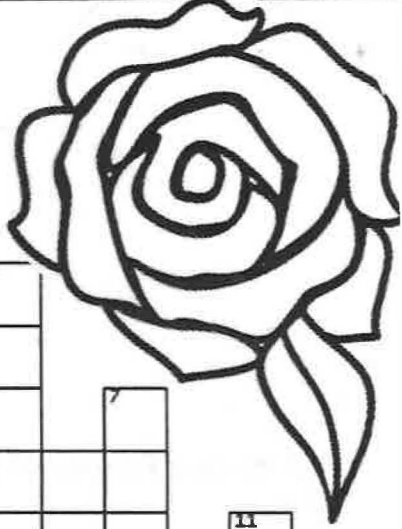
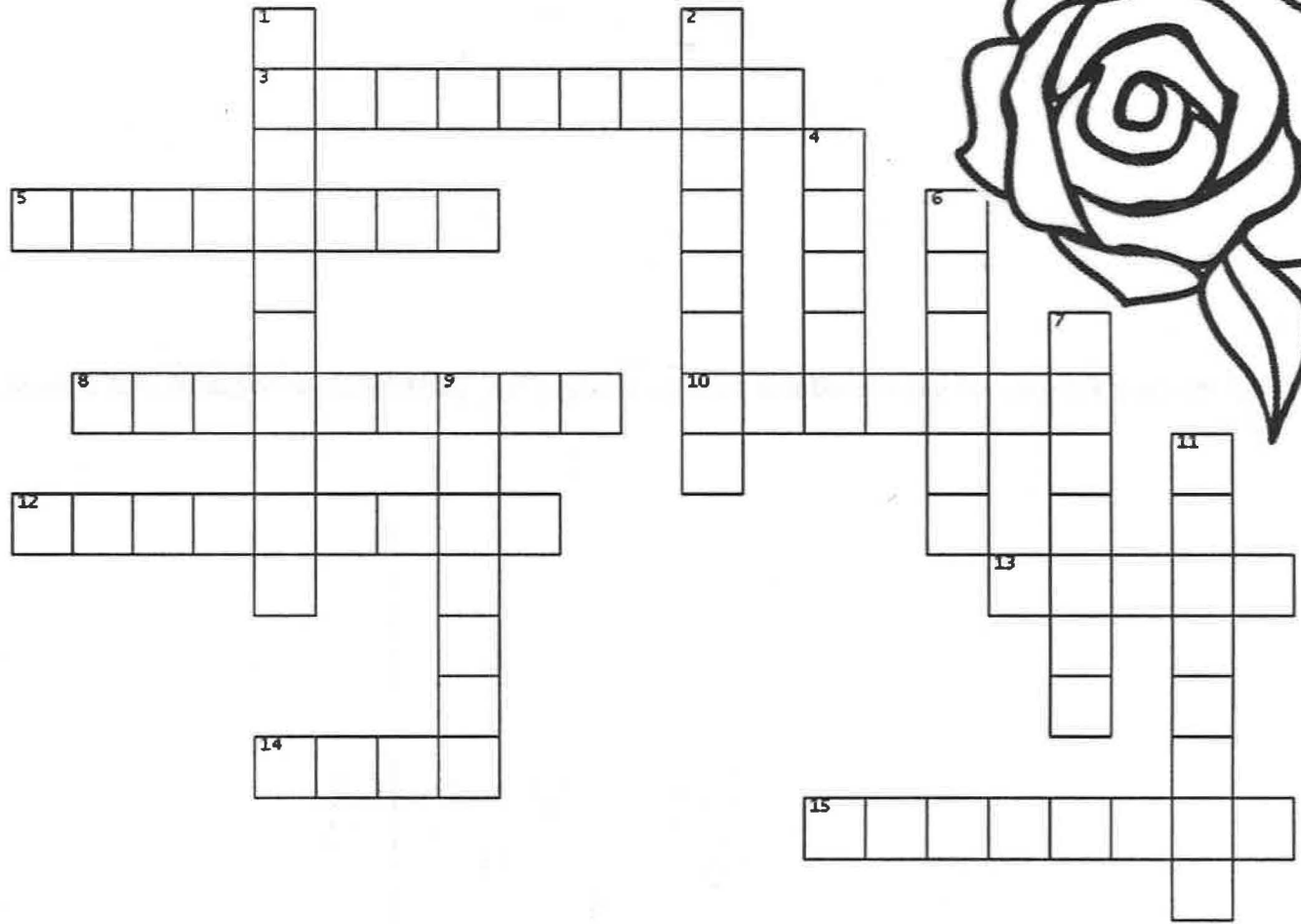
According to the Newsela, a man named Ryan Redington



won the 2023 Iditarod Trail Sled Dog Race on March 14, 2023. He is now the sixth Alaskan native to do so. Ryan and his dogs ran close to 1,000 miles

around gorges and mountains. This win was specifically important because his grandfather, Joe Redington, Sr, or "Father of the Iditarod" created the race and was a proficient dog musher. Joe started the race in 1973 with the help of a businesswoman named Dorothy Page. This year only 33 dog mushers ran the course, which is surprisingly low compared to other years, which averaged 63 racers. 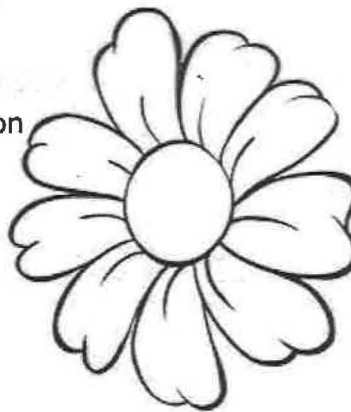
