


This year's club fair was packed! If you've always wanted to join a club, but don't know what the club is about or at what time they meet up, here are 6 of the many clubs available here at Fremont:





All of them have a cliffhanger leading to the next book. Along the way, the Baudelaires have many caretakers and babysitters that were very cruel to them.


