#### PROGRESS ON SIC GOALS FOR 2022-2023

By the end of the school year, 80% of students will meet or exceed the expected growth target in ELA/Literacy based on the STAR assessment. According to Winter STAR data, 71.8% of our students have met or exceeded the expected growth target in ELA.

By the end of the school year, 75% of students will meet or exceed the expected growth target in Math based on the STAR assessment. According to Winter STAR data, 70.6% of our students have met or exceeded the expected growth target in Math.
