ELOP PROGRAM PURPOSE

ELOP focuses on developing the **academic, social, emotional, & physical needs** of **unduplicated pupils*** through:

- Extending Instructional Learning Time
- Accelerating Learning
- Integrating Student Supports
- Supporting Staff Professional Development

***Unduplicated Pupils** are any students that qualify for one or more programs, Free & Reduced Lunch, Foster Youth, and English Learners.

ELOP PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS



ELOP increases the achievement of unduplicated pupils by providing access to after school and intersessional learning opportunities.

Academic School Year

- 9 hour day with wrap-around services
 - School day + after school program
- 180 days of service
- In OVSD, ELOP is after school only

Intersessional Days

- 9 hour day
 - Instruction + after instruction program
- 30 additional days during summer, Thanksgiving, Winter, or Spring breaks
- In OVSD, combined with the Summer Education Academy (SEA)



ELOP PROGRAM COMPONENT #1

Safe and Supportive Environment

An environment that supports the developmental, social-emotional, and physical needs of all students

- Existing Kids' Club and FLY combined with ELOP to provide one comprehensive after school program
- Oak View will continue participation in the After School Education and Safety (ASES) grant for 4th and 5th graders and will be expanded through ELOP
- Students are checked in electronically by staff and out by parents
- Emergency information is readily available for program staff



ELOP PROGRAM COMPONENT #2

Active and Engaged Learning

Active, meaningful and engaging learning that promotes collaboration and expands student horizons

- Homework help is embedded into the program schedule
- Dedicated technology and time to build math and literacy skills, including through i-Ready, ST Math, and silent reading
- Enrichment experiences promote collaboration, experimentation, critical thinking, creativity, communication, skill building, active engagement, and a sense of belonging



ELOP PROGRAM COMPONENT #3

Skill Building

Program goals include using 21st century skills and provide activities to achieve mastery

- Natural interests are nurtured through experiments that build reasoning and support higher order thinking
- Problem solving skills and critical thinking are developed through construction of elaborate structures based on the fundamental principles of engineering and physics using STEM curriculum
- Teamwork provides opportunities to advance social-emotional competencies, such as social awareness and relationship skills



ELOP PROGRAM COMPONENT #4

Youth Voice and Leadership

Students play a meaningful role in the program and are provided ongoing access to authentic leadership roles

- Students are empowered to identify projects and student-driven activities through monthly advisory group meetings
- Activities promote interpersonal relationships, collaboration, and teamwork to help students build skills in sharing their viewpoints, concerns, and interest
- Student-driven community projects will be developed and implemented



ELOP PROGRAM COMPONENT #5

Healthy Choices and Behavior

An environment that supports a healthy lifestyle, including nutrition, physical activity, and healthy choices

- Supports nutrition education and healthy meals/snacks through implementation of the OVSD Wellness Policy
- Daily physical activity through sports and outdoor games
- Age-appropriate developmental activities focused on play, taking turns, and sportsmanship are provided for younger students
- Each school's Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is utilized to ensure behavioral expectations are aligned



ELOP PROGRAM COMPONENT #6

Diversity, Access, and Equity

ELOP is designed to address cultural and linguistic diversity and provide opportunities to experience diversity, access, and equity

- Offered to all eligible students
- Bilingual support for families
- Coordination to link school events with ELOP to help students explore and highlight diversity through multicultural activities, performances, and family events



ELOP PROGRAM COMPONENT #7

Quality Staff

Recruit and retain high quality staff, creating a positive learning environment with ongoing professional development

- Internal candidates participate in two interviews, reference checks, a DOJ live scan background, and fingerprint check to demonstrate competency equivalent to instructional assistants
- First Aid and CPR trained, staff participate in ongoing professional development in areas, such as Quality Standards for Expanded Learning in California, Strategies for Working with English Learners, Behavior Management, and more
- Serve as role models building positive relationships with students

ELOP PROGRAM

Collaborative Partnerships

Districts are encouraged to collaborate with non-district entities to administer and implement ELOP programs

- Enrichment
 - Circle View, College View, Golden View, Hope View, Lake View, Star View, and Village View - - Play-Well (STEM and engineering), Gate Languages (Spanish language), Brainstorm (Lego robotics and engineering), and Breakthrough Sports (physical development and sport instruction)
 - Marine View, Mesa View, Spring View and Vista View - - Breakthrough Sports (basketball and volleyball)
- Programming
 - Oak View - - The Boys and Girls Clubs of Huntington Valley
 - Westmont - - Strategic Kids, LLC



ELOP PROGRAM

Continuous Quality Improvement

Assess strengths and weaknesses to improve program design, outcomes, and impact

- Multiple sources of data and feedback will be used to assess the strengths and areas of improvement for ELOP
- Data collection sources include self-assessments, review of the Quality Standards, parent, student, and staff surveys, and interviews and observation of program activities
- Academic achievement results, such as i-Ready scores, will be reviewed in addition to school attendance and ELOP participation



ELOP PROGRAM

Program Management

Practices and policies that support the fiscal and administrative requirements

- Overseen by Child Development Programs within the Educational Services Division
- Site administrators provide support during school office hours
- Eleyo software is used for student management
- Weekly staff meetings
- Regular professional development
