## COVID-19 Update

### Key Considerations

- The Regional Stay-At-Home orders were lifted last week.
- Orange County continues to be in the Purple Tier - Widespread based on case numbers per 100,000 ( $>7$ ) and testing positivity percentage ( $>8\%$ )
- OVSD students returned from temporary distance learning to in-person hybrid instruction on February 1st.

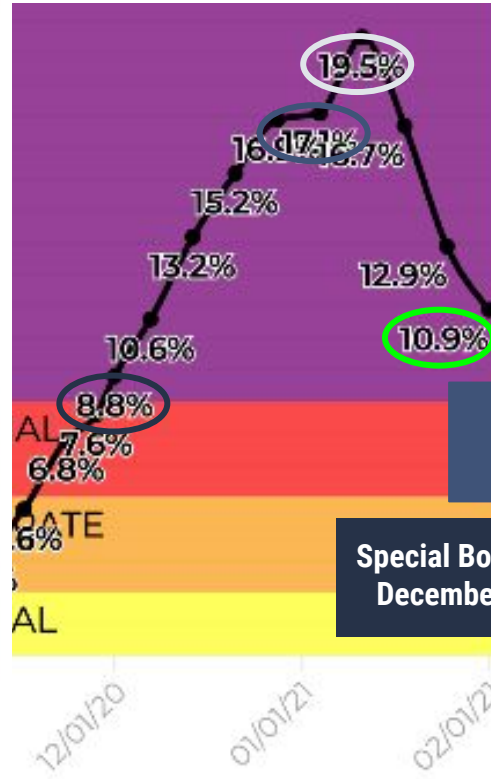
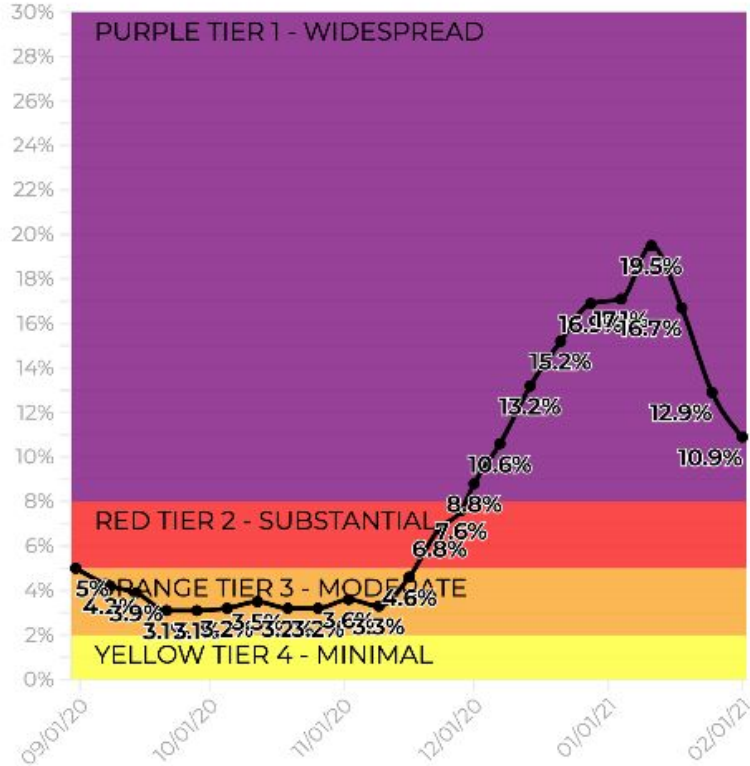

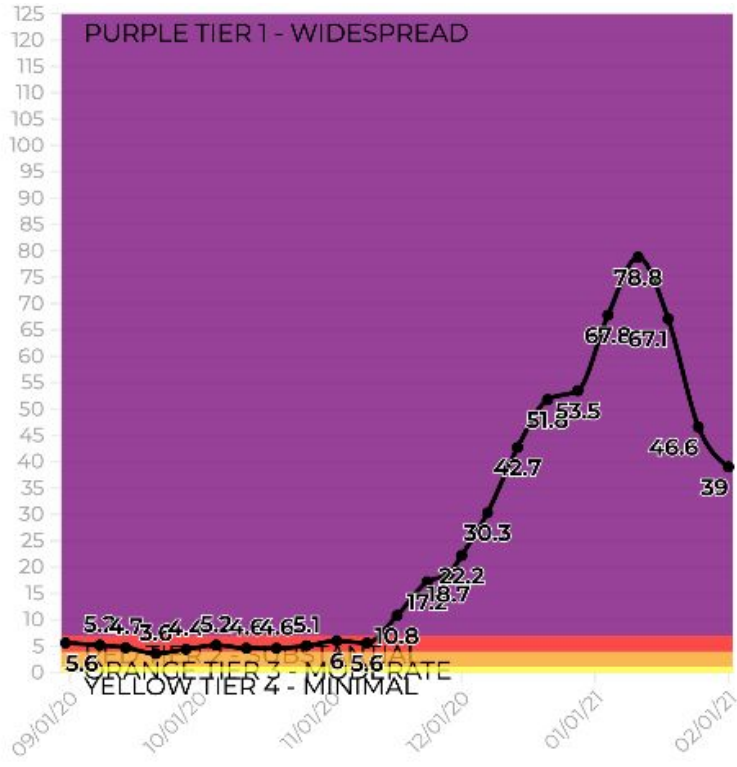

# COVID-19 Guidance Updates

## Background

On January 14, 2021 the State released new guidance, *COVID-19 and Reopening In-Person Instruction Framework & Public Health Guidance for K-12 Schools in California, 2020-2021 School Year*.

- Updates last guidance provided July 17, 2020
- Consolidates CDPH COVID-19 and other school-related guidance and supersedes previous CDPH COVID-19 and Cal/OSHA school guidance

## COVID-19 Guidance Updates

# COVID-19 Guidance Updates

## Face Coverings

- “Students in all grade levels K-12 are required to wear face coverings at all times, while at school, unless exempted”
- “Persons exempted from wearing a face covering due to a medical condition, ..., must wear a non-restrictive alternative, such as a face shield with a drape on the bottom edge, as long as their condition permits it.”

## Student Prescreening

- Student pre-screening at home before leaving for school





## COVID-19 Guidance Updates

### **Social Distancing**

- Stricter social distancing requirement of 4-6 feet, rather than “maintain 6 feet distance to the extent possible”

### **Disinfection**

- Frequency of disinfecting has been lessened

### **COVID-19 Testing**

- More frequent testing of students and staff

## Probable Case

A Probable Case is defined as an individual who has not taken a COVID-19 test but is symptomatic AND is a close contact with a confirmed or probable case of COVID-19.



## Next Steps

- Communicate and reinforce COVID-19 protocols to ensure consistency and safety of our students and staff.

- Continue to facilitate vaccination opportunities for staff.
