- Our intent is to provide support to students who participate in Special Day Classes (SDCs), by providing support on campus in small cohorts, and adhering to the 14:2 student to staff ratio.

- September 14: Remaining SDC classes @ all other school sites.

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Next Steps for Students

- Special Education Department will send a letter to notify families.
- Teachers will reach out to students to arrange specific schedules.
- Transportation will be arranged as needed.

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Next Steps for Staff:

- Special Education Department is developing specific schedules to return students in small cohorts per the regulations put forth by the California Department of Public Health.
- Special Education Department and Human Resources Division will communicate with staff.
- Staff will receive necessary training on safety protocols before returning to campus.
- Staff will receive necessary personal protective equipment before returning to campus.
