## Superintendent's Schools Task Force Update

Dr. Joe Farley, the facilitator of the Superintendent's Schools Task Force, provided the Board with an update on the first meeting that was held April 26. He stated that it is his hope that through the material discussed in the upcoming meetings, the Task Force will be able to fully conceptualize, understand, and articulate the challenges we are facing. In the upcoming meetings, the Task Force will discuss demographics, legal requirements, Measure R history/modernization, boundary adjustments, average daily attendance, school funding, enrollment decline, and the instructional impact of smaller schools. The next Task Force meeting is Wednesday, May 10.

## LCAP Update

Dr. Julianne Hofer, Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services, provided the Board with an update on the Local Control & Accountability Plan (LCAP). There are three broad LCAP goals with corresponding action steps and metrics: (1) Pupil Outcomes & Conditions of Learning, (2) Targeted Supports, and (3) Engagement. In addition to receiving Board input, Dr. Hofer stated that parents have an opportunity to provide input on the LCAP through a survey currently running through May 19.
