- 1. 6:10 p.m. Village View Elementary School: Bulletin Board Presentation**

Village View teachers Emily Hansen, Elizabeth Pavloff, and Brenda Slegers shared information about learning enrichment activities at the school, including the newly opened Marine Science Wet Lab. **3. Trustees' Communications**

Trustee Souders expressed his appreciation to the Village View teachers for showcasing their school's highlights and wonderful bulletin board; thanked Vista View's Principal Dr. Gates and student Kayce Hoang for sharing important information about their school, including programs, events, and daily activities.

Trustee Singer attended the Village View Marine Science Wet Lab ribbon-cutting event; pleased to attend the PTA/O/SA/SO Presidents' Roundtable meeting; along with Dr. Conroy and President Clayton-Tarvin, met with City officials regarding the Oak and Ash Streetscape Project; attended the monthly meeting of the Optimist's Club; attended the *Links to Learning* Grant Award Ceremony sponsored by the Assistance League of Huntington Beach, where teachers received over \$21,000.00 in academic grant awards; mentioned she met the newest Guide Dog in Training, Stella, at Hope View School; attended the Boys and Girls Club Annual Benefit Event.

Trustee Briscoe spoke highly of the accomplishments of Village View teacher Elizabeth Pavloff's son and thanked her for sharing information on the District's writing continuum; pleased to hear from Vista View student Kayce Hoang about oral lecture note-taking in her classes.

President Clayton-Tarvin was pleased to see so many audience members, and thanked them for coming; thanked the presenters from both Village View and Vista View who shared information about their school sites; attended Hope View's Back-to-School Night and thanked the teachers for their continued professionalism in all they do on a daily basis for our students; attended the Boys and Girls Club Annual Benefit Event; attended the Optimist Club meeting; commented on her recent ride-along with the Huntington Beach Police

Department, where she learned more about the City and how we can work collaboratively in the future; thanked Ocean View Teachers Association for their endorsement of her campaign for City Council; mentioned she will be meeting with CSEA next week to request their endorsement; pleased to be endorsed by the Huntington Beach Police Officers' Association, the Huntington Beach Firefighters' Association, and the Association of Orange County Deputy Sheriffs.

#### **4. Superintendent's Communications**

Dr. Conroy informed the Board that the District has a new receptionist, Flor Romero, who greets the community when they visit the District Office. He thanked Craig Sample and Kim Slack, Facilities Department Supervisors, for working with Curriculum Specialist Shannon Mudry to enhance the kindergarten playgrounds with tree stumps, which will facilitate the building of gross motor skills, socialization skills, and comprehensive language skills. The Initial English Language Proficiency Assessments were successfully completed by students within the required timeframe at all 14 school sites Districtwide. Dr. Conroy expressed appreciation to the hardworking, dedicated Emerging Bilingual support staff, including Julie Slater, Samiha Habib, Liliana Montes, Jennifer Wilson, Maria Harding, Jennifer Lara, Patricia Sanchez, Nancy Silva, Kathy Sumner, Janice Lee, Christine Craig, Buu Nguyen, and Carmen Sanchez.

Dr. Conroy congratulated Mesa View teacher Brett Hardy on recently completing requirements for a single subject credential in the area of industrial and technology education. Mr. Hardy's Industrial Technology class is a blend of traditional wood shop integrated with technology, and the Board is invited to observe the class when they visit Mesa View.

Dr. Conroy advised that AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) is now a year-long elective offered to all Spring View Middle School students for the first time this school year, promoting college and career readiness through rigorous academic preparedness. He shared that the Spring View AVID Site Team organized a field trip to visit USC's Student for a Day Event, and 36 Ocean View students participated. He expressed his appreciation to Principal Ortiz and AVID Site Team Leaders Kasey Smith and Stacy Kral for providing this opportunity for our students.

Along with Trustee Singer, he met with City officials to review the proposal for the Oak and Ash Streetscape Improvement Project, to include a process that would involve the community in the area. He also attended the monthly Optimist's Meeting, joining Principals Jenna Landero, Isis Ortiz, and Tami Benane.

Dr. Conroy attended the *Links to Learning* Grant Awards Ceremony sponsored by the Assistance League of Huntington Beach (ALHB), along with Trustee Singer, Dr. Hoefler, principals, and 47 teachers representing their schools. ALHB distributed over \$20,000.00 in grant funding to the teachers in support of instruction.

He attended the first Superintendent Leadership Series meeting at Orange County Department of Education, and began pre-evaluation meetings with site Principals. Prior to attending Hope View's Back-to-School Night, he attended the Ocean View School Administrators Association social at a local restaurant, and enjoyed connecting with colleagues in this venue. Along with President Clayton-Tarvin and Trustee Singer, he attended the ribbon-cutting ceremony for Village View's Marine Science Wet Lab, and joined Trustee Singer at the PTA/O/SA/SO Presidents' Roundtable meeting chaired by President Kim Fatum.

He commented on his recent visits to College View and Golden View during "Coaching Tuesdays" and acknowledged Golden View teacher Julie Neubert for teaching grammar note-taking to her 5th grade students.

Dr. Conroy discussed the negotiated agreements with OVTA and CSEA, both passing unanimously by their respective memberships. He noted this is the first time in over 20 years that a budget with a double-digit salary increase combined with an increase to the District's medical benefits contribution has been presented to the Board for approval. In addition, the AB1200 Budget Report contains a balanced current year budget, a healthy multi-year budget, a strong ending balance, and no deficit spending, which meets every Board priority discussed in the past. He recognized members of OVTA, CSEA, Management/Confidential, and Leadership Team members in the audience.

Lastly, he stated that the California Distinguished Schools sign that has been in the Board Room behind the dais has been moved to the reception area in Building C in preparation for new, modern signage that will be installed in the Board Room later this month.

**5. PTA/PTO/PTSA/PTSO Presidents' Roundtable**

Kim Fatum, Roundtable President, provided information about the October 3, 2022, Roundtable Meeting. Discussion topics included bike safety programs, crossing guard needs and funding sources; Aeries communication preferences; Chromebook insurance; and notification of road closures. School sites are busy with Back-To-School Nights, Trunk or Treat events, planning for Red Ribbon Week, Book Fairs, and other fundraising projects.

Jason Bozarth, CSEA President, commented on CSEA's Tentative Agreement with the District, which will help to attract and retain quality staff members to Ocean View School District; urged the Board to vote in support of CSEA's Tentative Agreement on tonight's agenda.

Heidi Webb, OVTA President, expressed appreciation on behalf of the teachers for being recognized for the work that they do on a daily basis; is looking forward to the positive vote tonight on OVTA's Tentative Contractual Agreement.

**4. Educational Services: Agreement Between Ocean View School District of Orange County and BEAM, LLC, For Instructional Assistant Services (Action)**

MOTION by John Briscoe and seconded by Patricia Singer to approve.

After discussion regarding the contract's incorrect end date noted by Trustee Westwell, a substitute motion was made by Patricia Singer and seconded by Norm Westwell to correct the end date of the contract to June 23, 2023 (replacing June 23, 2022.)

President Clayton-Tarvin questioned the need for this item that will cost \$380,000.00.

Dr. Conroy explained that many districts are facing challenging times as they attempt to hire people for open positions. Upon approval of this contract, eight aides would serve our special needs' students, whose Individualized Education Programs require this service.

When asked to elaborate, Dr. Conroy talked about the need for a more aggressive recruitment process for potential employees. Another problem surfacing is the time frame in which the process takes once an application is submitted. He shared that the lack of people who are applying for jobs, as well as the delay in processing applications, have now forced the District to contract out for such services, including HVAC and Afterschool Program needs.

Dr. Hoefer shared about the significant impact the shortage has had on teachers and students. She noted that we have administrators serving as instructional assistants in the classrooms. Also, our afterschool programs and preschool programs have waiting lists, due to the lack of staff available to provide these services.

Trustee Singer expressed concern that it is taking three to five months to process applicants.

Dr. Conroy indicated that there are timeframes to follow in the Merit System process, but there seems to be gaps in the timeframes between sections in that process, which have resulted in months of delays in some cases. A result of this lengthy process is that high-quality applicants who are applying to other districts, are hired elsewhere, and we are left with a weak candidate pool.

Further discussion ensued regarding whether the applicants are just not out there, or whether the hiring process is so lengthy that applicants go elsewhere, or a combination of both.

To address the concerns expressed, President Clayton-Tarvin requested that a special report be presented to the Board, explaining the hiring process for both Certificated and Classified applicants. Dr. Conroy advised that he will work with Assistant Superintendent Headrick and Director Vellanoweth to prepare the requested presentation.

Trustee Briscoe discussed the responsibility of the appointed Personnel Commissioners regarding this issue, and would like to gather their input in the report as well.

Trustee Westwell concurred with including the recommendations from the Personnel Commissioners in this report.


