1. 6:05 p.m. Lake View Elementary School: Bulletin Board Presentation

Lake View Principal Jill Van Der Linden shared insights on how the STEAM school is shaping critical thinkers, while increasing student achievement. 3. Personnel Commissioner Report (Three Minutes)

Bob Ewing, Chair, Personnel Commission, shared the latest updates regarding recent recruitments and hirings completed by the Personnel Commission (PC) staff; thanked the Educational Services Division for collaborating with PC staff to expedite the hiring process for Universal Instructional Assistants; expressed his support of the reappointment of Commissioner Lance Bidnick.

4. Trustees' Communications (Three Minutes per Board Member)

Vice President Clayton-Tarvin thanked the public speakers for sharing their comments tonight; reminded everyone that no decision has been made, but she has voiced her opposition to school closures since the beginning, due to the traumatizing effect such an action would have on the community, parents, and students. She shared her personal experience involving her child when he attended Golden View, and the strong, educational foundation provided to him there; noted that she works in a school district which has prioritized and maintained low enrollment at schools; mentioned that the Board may have different opinions regarding school consolidation, but assured everyone that the entire Board cares about the community.

Clerk Souders expressed his appreciation to everyone for attending tonight's meeting; stated that this matter should have been brought to the Board prior to the start of modernization, and thanked President Singer for agendizing the matter now for consideration on a subject long overdue; shared his experience with Golden View as a parent whose children attended the school; pleased that the public speakers reminded him of the importance and preciousness of the school, as it is a singularly unique school in the area with its farm.

Trustee Westmoreland commended the student speakers for sharing their opinions tonight; mentioned that she does not want to close schools, but also does not want to make a decision due to lack of action that would adversely affect the District in upcoming years; noted that as a parent, she is upset that the Board and community was not engaged sooner, as well as being upset with past decisions, including misrepresentation during Measure R funding allocation decisions, which has resulted in a disservice to the community; thanked President Singer for agendizing the matter now and engaging the community in discussions; asked the public to continue to engage with the Board, as she stated there is more we can do rather than just close schools.

Trustee Westwell thanked everyone for attending tonight's meeting and expressing their concerns; talked about the ongoing issues of declining enrollment and fiscal impacts that will continue even after tonight's vote; agreed this matter should have been addressed long ago; asked for the public's assistance in bringing more students to the District.

President Singer discussed how the conversations and public engagement regarding this matter began at the beginning of the year; pleased that the issue has now been brought to the forefront and shared with the community; expressed empathy with the comments shared tonight, noting she does not want to close schools, but also needs to ensure the District is balanced and operating well; thanked the Task Force members and the staff for their diligent work in proposing and addressing options presented; urged the public to continue engaging with the Board to find solutions that work for the District and community.

5. Superintendent's Communications

Dr. Conroy highlighted some of the people and connections making a difference in the District.

Principal Jessica Haag and Curriculum Specialist Lori Manz were acknowledged for presenting at the 49th Annual Orange County Council (OCC) GATE Conference at California State University, Fullerton, on October 28. Their session, "Unleashing Creativity: Exploring the Power of Generative Artificial Intelligence," was well attended by educators throughout Orange County.

Star View fourth grade students enjoyed a wonderful trip to historic Mission San Juan Capistrano on November 6. The annual trip was completely funded by the generous support of The Nicholas Endowment. Students were treated to a "Mission Matters" assembly, and were able to make a real adobe brick to take home. The District is grateful to community partners like the Nicholas Endowment that enrich the education of young people. A big thank you to teachers Tony Dybas, Leslie Flores, Janine Cadiente, and Laura Erickson for their leadership of the Star View students.

In the Information Technology (IT) Department, Multimedia Technician Steve Hunter was recognized for his work with contractors to ensure all school sites have their bells and camera systems operating smoothly. Field Service Technician Travis Hunter and Multimedia Technician Bill Heyer have resolved more than 500 IT service tickets and repaired over 600 Chromebooks since the start of the school year. Their efforts keep the schools' technology running, help teachers and staff operate efficiently, and enhance students' learning and achievement every day.

Noting there is no school next week due to the Thanksgiving holiday break, Dr. Conroy extended his appreciation to all teachers, support staff, principals, and the Leadership Team for their outstanding commitment to the students in Ocean View School District. He wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving and a relaxing time spent with family and friends.

N. Old Business: None.**O. New Business****1. Superintendent's Office: Approve School Consolidation of Spring View Middle School (Action)**

Dr. Conroy provided a detailed report on school consolidation. He noted that consolidation and closure of schools due to declining enrollment is a complex and multifaceted issue that many districts are facing today. Although the District has repeatedly consolidated and closed schools since 1981 because of declining enrollment, the issue of declining enrollment has continued in recent years and is now impacting the District's instructional program, facility needs, budget, and more. The District's enrollment in 2010 was 9,554 and is projected to be 5,563 by the year 2030, a decline of approximately 4,000 students. Such a significant decline in student population will lead to an underutilization of resources, including staffing, facilities, and funding. The Board must decide the number and location of school sites to operate for optimum student learning and achievement now, and in the next five to ten years.

In February 2023, Dr. Conroy presented a recommendation to the Board to potentially close and consolidate schools and move students to other schools to address the District's low schools' enrollment. After two community meetings, the Superintendent was directed by the Board President to form a committee to address the District's continued declining enrollment and low schools' enrollment. The resulting Superintendent's Schools Task Force was created to develop a range of future options for the Board of Trustees to consider in addressing these ongoing issues.

Details of the Task Force composition, meetings, and information presented to the members were shared. Creative solutions developed by the Task Force were presented to the Board for consideration. In addition to the Task Force recommendations, public comments during Board meetings and Special Study Sessions, emails directed to Board members and staff, as well as written communications to the Board, have been taken into careful consideration in forming this recommendation.

Dr. Conroy recommended the following actions be taken, effective in the 2024-25 school year:

-Consolidate Spring View Middle School, consolidate the middle school students into other middle schools, and relocate the District Office to the Spring View site.

-Consolidate Golden View Elementary School, consolidate the elementary school students into other elementary schools, and repurpose the facility into a District Environmental Science Center to serve the needs of students Districtwide.

-Not to consolidate Village View Elementary School and consider relocating the Special Education programs to other school sites.

-Not to consolidate Circle View Elementary School and to consider reviewing the District's GATE Program enrollment and transfer practices.

President Singer noted that an item would be forthcoming to dissolve the Board Subcommittee on School Consolidation, as their work has been completed.

R. Board of Trustees' Roundtable

Vice President Clayton-Tarvin attended Marine View's Chuck Wagon fundraiser night; visited Circle View's carnival, a celebration reward for the read-a-thon project completed by Circle View's students; met with Circle View parents and the Village View delegation, separately, to hear their concerns; honored to represent all parents in the District; mentioned that Vista View's enrollment has increased due to the recent consolidation of middle school students living in the Oak View area that now attend Vista View Middle School.

Clerk Souders thanked everyone in the audience for staying so late; reminded the public that the District Office property was a school at one time, and is still a school structurally, so moving the offices to another school site would be feasible; wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.

Trustee Westmoreland thanked the audience for staying at this late hour; acknowledged that a decision was made tonight to consolidate a school and knows the District will have an open, transparent plan of communication to the families and students affected; impressed by the parents with whom she has met and looks forward to continued engagement with the community; plans to visit schools more often in the future; wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving break.

Trustee Westwell reminded his colleagues about the money recently spent to rehabilitate the District Office, noting he has continuously voted against such expenditures; urged the Board to be more financially responsible as they approve District expenditures using taxpayer monies; thanked everyone for attending tonight's meeting and becoming involved; wished all a wonderful Thanksgiving.

President Singer acknowledged the difficult conversations had tonight, but views this as a positive move, as the community became involved with their elected officials regarding an important matter; stated she does not take lightly the decision to consolidate schools, but when the District cannot offer robust electives in a middle school with low enrollment, that is an inequitable situation that must be addressed; shared that Spring View families will be kept apprised via transparent communication and dialog, regarding transportation and transfer processes, as well as all other pertinent information during this transition; wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.


