Hope View Principal Christy Luckey and teachers Marci McLaughlin, Audie Kuns, and Amy Dempsen shared highlights of the Transitional Kindergarten (TK) classes at Hope View. Referencing pictures on the back wall bulletin boards, Principal Luckey spoke about TK learning that is play based and hands-on, with opportunities to explore the world through the senses and develop critical thinking skills. The TK curriculum is supported by the Preschool Foundations and Curriculum Framework, the District's Writing Continuum, music and art classes, as well as outdoor interactive learning environments. The teachers shared examples with the Board of items used to help



students work on fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination, and hand strength. TK students are developing skills in social emotional growth, academic growth, and beyond!
