VAPA Components

VISUAL ARTS

Each student works at a personalized pace to learn and develop self-expression and self-confidence. Students learn to observe, use their imaginations, and create.

MUSIC

As part of weekly music classes, all students in Transitional Kindergarten through fifth grade develop listening skills, sing age-appropriate songs, use hands-on rhythm instruments, and build vocabulary while learning to read music notation.

BAND (UPPER GRADES)

As part of our unique elementary band program, fourth and fifth grade students can learn to play flute, clarinet, alto saxophone, trumpet, trombone, baritone, or percussion twice per week during school hours.
