SCHOOLS REPORT

Dr. Jessica Lynn - Exceptional Services Coordinator

- On March 18th, ACS Exceptional Services partnered with the Alabama Dept. of Rehabilitation Services to provide a "Senior Transition Night" with various community vendors to offer exiting students resources for their post-secondary plans.
- Special Olympics Track & Field will be held on April 19th at the Athens stadium. We invite everyone to come out to support our special athletes!
 - A "Managing Crisis Safely" training was recently held with select staff to teach de-escalation strategies when working with students with challenging behavior. Thank you to Mrs. Lorian Charles and Mr. Phillip Jarmon, our district trainers!
 - Special Education Teachers participated in "IEP Spring Training" on March 15th to provide refreshers and updates on Special Education processes.

<u>iAcademy – Athens Elementary</u>

AES recently wrapped up our latest family engagement initiative, *One School One Book*. During the end of February and the first week of March, all K-3 students and families were engaged together in reading the literary classic <u>Charlotte's Web</u>. Each family received a free copy of the book, and students participated in school read-alouds each day as well as daily trivia questions and fun activities related to their reading. Our culminating activity was a family movie night during Read Across America Week where school personnel, students and families were able to watch the

movie Charlotte's Web. We had a huge turnout for family movie night! We had so much fun during *One School One Book*! It was such a fun and unique way to focus on literacy and encourage family engagement, and we are looking forward to picking out a book for next year!

We treated our English language learner students to an ice cream party on March 6th at the conclusion of their month long ACCESS testing. ACCESS is a state mandated test that all of our 112 K-3 ELL students take. Students are tested in 7 domains and given a composite score that shows their proficiency in the English Language. Our students worked so hard during this test and we are so proud of them!

Our 3rd graders will attend a field trip on Friday, March 22, to Cook Museum in Decatur. This field trip is courtesy of a 3 year grant from Steelcase and covers both the ticket price for students as well as their participation in an engaging education class. We are so excited for this hands-on learning experience!

<u>Heart Academy – Julian Newman Elementary</u>

- HEART Lab Specialist, Diane Trout was awarded several grants for resources to enhance instruction, especially in the area of Digital Literacy and Computer Science. They are as follows:
 - o TVA Stem Grant in the amount of \$3,500.00 to fund 10 Spike Robotics Kits
 - o AMSTI Robotics Grant in the amount of \$3,500.00 to fund an additional 10 Spike Robotics Kits
 - o STEDTRAIN Grant in the amount of \$2,461.00 for 2 tower gardens and supplies for Hydroponics
- Mrs. Diane Trout was also awarded a foundational grant this fall to purchase glasses for the upcoming eclipse on April 8. The first grade students are bringing in sun chips, sundrop, and moon pies to enjoy during the eclipse. This activity correlates with the 1st grade science standard 1.8-Observe, describe, and predict patterns of the sun, moon, and stars as they appear in the sky (e.g., sun and moon appearing to rise in one part of the sky, move across the sky, and set; stars other than our sun being visible at night, but not during the day).
- During the month of February, in Honor of Black History Month, third grade students shared informational facts about famous African Americans each morning on the intercom.
- Our House System recently held a community outreach project with our local Boys and Girls Club. The House of Global Citizens hosted a gently used book drive where students were asked to bring in gently used books. These books were then sorted and distributed back out to students so that each student was able to take home a "new" book of their choice. The remaining books will be donated to the Boys and Girls Club.
- February was National School Counseling Week and we honored Mrs. Holland for all of the things she does, not only to help students, but also our teachers and community.
- HEART Academy recently participated in an online fundraiser to help benefit the American Heart Association. The Kids Heart Challenge (formerly known as Jump Rope For Heart) began February 1st and ended on the 29th. During this time, students were encouraged to collect donations for AHA and participate in online challenges with their families. Every year we take this opportunity to learn about heart health and emotional well being while having fun and saving lives. We have 3 of our very own Heart Heroes here at JNES. Walker Smith, Layla Madden and Derrick Ward have all undergone heart surgery and now are teaching how to help others. We raised over \$7,000.00 this year! So exciting for our school and students!

- Read Across America was celebrated last week, March 4th through March 8, 2024. We
 celebrated Dr. Suess' birthday with cupcakes and planned themed dress up days and reading
 challenges for the week.
- The HEART of Gold Luncheon was held on March 12th. This is a "Royal" celebration for special students selected by their teacher to join the Principal and Assistant Principal for a special lunch.
- Our third House Lunch was held on Wednesday, March 13th. This is a scheduled opportunity for students to gather together for lunch in their common houses. The four Houses correlate to our Portrait of a Graduate Character Traits.
- Our Book Fair will be held March 18th-22nd.

Fame Academy - Brookhill Elementary

- A grant from Dekko has provided us with the opportunity to provide enrichment opportunities for the students of FAME Academy and without charge to students who receive free or reduced lunch.
- We had 19 students who took ballet class after school on Thursday afternoons from January 18 -March 21, 2024.
- We had 17 students who took part in Krav Maga instruction on Wednesday afternoons from January 31 - March 20, 2024
- We have 41 students who have participated in basketball clinics from February 20 April 26, 2024.
- A total of 77 students participated!
- We offered tutoring for students before and after school from February 6 March 21, 2024.
 19 students before school and 39 students after school received additional instructional support for a total of 58 students.
- Cinderella rehearsals have begun. We will have two performances Friday, May 3 and Saturday, May 4, 2024.
- 3rd Grade Violin Recital is scheduled for Thursday, May 23, 2024.
- Third grade will be hosting a showcase of their current PBL Unit on Friday, March 22, 2024 @ 1:30.

SPARK Academy - Cowart Elementary School

- The school raised approximately \$4500 during our Nothing Bundt Cake Fundraiser.
- Mrs. Jennifer Kennedy, our STEM specialist, was awarded a AUVSI Pathfinder Grant for \$2500.00. These funds will be used to purchase Lego kits and replace Dash robots.
- 2nd grade classes partnered with AHS Engineering class to test parachute designs and implement the engineering design process.
- Sprocket, the Trash Pandas mascot, visited first grade classes to kick off their reading program. Mar 20, 2024
- 1st grade students performed their sound and light music program under black lights to showcase their learning. March 18 and 22, 2024
- Second semester Athens State University science methods students had their first school visit. They observed management in a science classroom with Mrs. Kennedy. Mar 12, 2024.

• Teachers participated in Learning Walks in which they observed their grade level peers working with students to complete tasks.

Athens Intermediate School:

- Our 5th graders experienced the Aquarist for the Day Field Trip at Cook Museum. Each student was able to dissect their own shark and squid as they learned more about animal structures. They also explored behind the scenes to understand more about how an aquarium is maintained.
- Our February Book Fair was a success. Students were able to eat lunch and shop with special visitors all during the week.
- During our Lunch Cafe Series, students experienced the sounds of a Bluegrass Band and a Saxophone Soloist.
- Athens Intermediate School served as host for the Limestone County Spelling Bee.
- Students were given an opportunity to shine during our annual AIS Talent Show.
- Our 4th graders traveled to Birmingham to visit the McWane Science Center.
- Read Across America Week was celebrated with dress-up days, read-aloud by special visitors, and the AIS Fox in Socks After-School Bash.
- Our 4th graders celebrated Black History Month by conducting research projects on historically black universities and famous African Americans. They used their research to design and create floats. Afterward, they utilized their presentation skills to share their projects with classmates.
- Our school held its first Kaleidoscope Festival. Students and families were able to rotate through art and music stations, try out different instruments, and participate in a family drum circle.

- Our Art Department has a lot to be happy about this semester. First, congratulations to Lou Chesnut for her outstanding achievement in the Alabama State Superintendent's Visual Art Exhibit.
