ACADEMIC EXPECTATIONS

- Social skills
 - How to be a good friend, take turns, raise my hand, inside voice, cleaning up, healthy peer conflict, hand washing
- Writing
 - Practice drawing curved, slanted, and straight lines
 - Develop hand strength for holding a writing utensil
- Reading
 - Listening to a story, read as often as possible
 - Build conversational skills around books being read
- Math
 - Counting orally to 5
 - Grouping items
 - Recognizing shapes
 - Patterns

WHAT ELSE DO WE DO IN A DAY OF KINDERGARTEN?

- Recess- 30 minutes
- Lunch- 30 minutes
- Encore (art, music, library, PE, health, counselor)- 60 minutes/daily
- Academics- chunked throughout the day
 - Math- 60
 - Reading- 45
 - Writing- 45
 - Phonics instruction- 30
 - Guided reading- 40

CAR RIDER DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

All car riders will be given a card with a number on it. This sign must be visible in the car window when picking up your child. This will allow the teachers on duty to easily match student(s) with parent. Please make sure any person you wish to pick up your child has a card in the car window and that they are on the enrollment form to do so. We ask that ALL car riders follow this procedure.

BUS RIDERS

• In an effort to increase safety measures when transporting your child, the NKC School District implemented a bus pass (ZPass) for students. ZPass is a tool that enables the transportation department to increase the safety of your child by logging the time and location of where your child is being picked up and dropped off.



BUS RIDERS

- The number printed on the ZPass card is assigned to your child and will be his or hers throughout the school years in the North Kansas City School District.
- The only expectation of your child is to always wear the backpack to which the ZPass card is attached. Attaching the card to his or her backpack will prevent your child from misplacing it.
- If the ZPass card/backpack is lost, please report it to the school Administrative Assistant right away.

 - Make sure you download the app and connect to your child's class
 - Teachers send information on a regular basis to the whole class via a message board and to individual families
- Monthly newsletters will give families highlights of upcoming and important information
- -Student Absences
 - Please inform the office of any absences
 - Student attendance is very important. Please try your best to schedule appointments before and after school and please try not to take vacations during school time.
 - We have monthly incentives for attendance as well as class incentives!

HOW CAN I PREPARE FOR KINDERGARTEN?

- Start setting and practicing routines (bedtime, morning, after school)
 - · Practicing eating on a timer- we get 30 minutes for lunch
 - Opening items such as milk, containers, packages
 - Tying our shoes or practicing velcro
- Start talking about school and building up stamina for a school day
