
Motor Lab

The kindergarten and first grade students have been experiencing a new program this year called Motor Lab. Ms. Tracy Atkinson, a licensed physical therapy assistant, works with small groups two times per week. The goal of Motor Lab is to help students develop the skills necessary for learning readiness and mastery of their environment. By participating in the Motor Lab students increase their understanding of how their bodies move and process information with motor, visual, tactile, proprioceptive, vestibular, and auditory systems. They also have a great time! Students were first instructed with exercises to build a foundation for strengthening core muscles, controlled arm movements, and crossing midline. Then, they progressed to learning individual

stations to complete the exercises/activities.

Activities During Motor Lab:

- Build student's core muscles, midline crossing, bilateral coordination, fine and gross motor skills
- Improve students' ability to maneuver and function in their environment, leading them to better performances in tasks such as handwriting, sitting still, paying attention, and behavior
- Stimulate children's sensory systems
- Increase students' abilities to better control themselves and to accomplish tasks by making children aware of their environment and how their bodies move in space
- Create foundations for skills needed in physical education
