REGULAR CALLED MEETING

1. Mrs. West opened the meeting at 4:15 pm stating that a quorum had been established with 22 of 29 members present.
2. Good Things / Positives were shared by several members.
 - a. Lauren Reid shared that the softball girls had a big win over Douglass.
 - b. Emily Gound expressed excitement about 24 students advancing to the UIL Academic Regional Meet.
 - c. Kelly West applauded the 2nd grade teachers and Nurse Dover for their professional handling of a medical emergency earlier that day.
 - d. Kelly West shared that Alto ISD will offer free breakfast and lunch this summer for all children ages 18 and under. The children are not required to be students.
3. Superintendent West turned the floor over to the SHAC Director, Nurse Dover to give an overview of the services that have been provided to the students, staff, and community this school year.
4. Nurse Dover highlighted the following SHAC accomplishments for 23-24:
 - a. Leo and Vicki Baum, Shannon Duplichain, Connie Hamilton, and Linda Brooks were recognized for their diligent work on the Backpack Program which has fed 52 kids this year.
 - b. Volunteers for feeding student athletes throughout the year
 - c. Carter Care Blood Drives
 - d. Child car seat safety demonstration
 - e. Vision and hearing screenings
 - f. Spinal screenings
 - g. Flu vaccine clinic
 - h. 6th & 12th grade vaccine clinic
 - i. Allergy plan is in place and being managed well by the Food Service Department.
 - j. Life Vacs were purchased and put in each office, daycare, cafeteria, and nurse's office

- k. Two new AEDs were purchased this year to replace older ones with plans to phase in two more new ones in the upcoming school year.
 - l. Fentanyl education for 6th - 12th grade was provided this year.
 - m. Stop the Bleed Training was conducted for 7th - 12th graders as well as AISD Staff.
 - n. CPR education was provided for 7th - 12th grade students.
 - o. Narcan training was conducted with staff members.
 - p. B12 and LipoC shots were offered to all employees as part of the Staff Wellness Plan.
5. Counselor Rabago highlighted SHAC accomplishments for 23-24 pertaining to mental health, counseling, and guidance.
- a. Character Strong, a social emotional curriculum, has been utilized for elementary - high school age students.
 - b. Sandy Hook Promise, suicide awareness and prevention
 - c. Reallyville
 - d. Red Ribbon Week - alcohol and drug awareness
 - e. Play It Safe - dating violence and sex trafficking awareness
 - f. TCHATT (Texas Child Health Access Through Telemedicine) and YAM (Youth Aware of Mental Health) - telehealth / telemedicine programs through UT Tyler
 - g. Stop It - Anonymous reporting system for students or staff
6. Safety Director, Amber Middleton, stated that Nurse Dover and Counselor Rabago had covered the initiatives that overlapped with SHAC safety.
7. Superintendent West expressed the need to find a new platform for providing Sex Education Curriculum for the upcoming year.
8. Superintendent West suggested the need for providing more options for staff wellness for the upcoming year. Suggestions included:
- a. After-school walking or workouts
 - b. Walk Across America - Teams compete against other teams in the county (Extension Service)
 - c. Gym memberships discounts for groups

- d. Relief time provided to employees at lunch time to walk or workout. Add time onto lunch break.
- e. AISD Athletic Trainer, Jacolby Whitaker, lead a group of staff members on a wellness journey
- f. Vaping and pouch awareness (Zens) provided for students
- g. Dangers of energy drinks and pre-workout drinks on student health
