With the highest weighted GPA of 106.400 among 242 students, Michael Earvolino has been named Sayville High School's Class of 2017 Valedictorian and will be graduating with a distinguished S.T.E.M. (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) Academy designation for completing rigorous High School curriculum and authentic research projects.

Michael's strong passion for science and technology has guided his curriculum choices. In his freshman year, he began working with Ms. Maria Brown in the R.I.S.E. Program, and as a sophomore, expanded his horizons with the R.I.S.E.

Tech Program that honed his technology skills. In addition to academic achievements, he has demonstrated great aptitude in a range of technical subjects from robotics through computer programming, 3-D printing, graphics, and chemistry.

Class of 2017 Salutatorian

Matthew Tomko holds the second highest weighted GPA of 106.328 among 242 students and has been named Sayville High School's Class of 2017 Salutatorian.

An outstanding student, Matt is a member of the National Honor Society, Treasurer in Tri-M Music Honor Society, and was named National Merit Scholar Finalist. He has taken a total of twelve AP classes—earning him an AP Scholar with Distinction designation—and fifteen Honors classes, including Scientific Research and R.I.S.E Tech with Research Teachers Maria Brown and Rick Caskey. Through this program, Matt's research has been groundbreaking. His analysis of the Riemann Hypothesis, explained

as "a hypothesis regarding a complex mathematical function from a perspective of continued fractions..." is paving the way for future research on this topic."

stated, "who is always thinking 'outside of the box,' problem-solving and moving forward on interesting and innovative projects."

His was the creative mind that addressed a need and successfully developed a mobile application that helped parents use their Android smart phones to navigate the high school building on Go To School Nights. As a result of this accomplishment, Michael was invited to the 2016 Long Island STEM Hub Annual Celebration and Student Showcase at Brookhaven National Laboratory to present his Open School Night application, and for the past two academic years, Michael has participated in a Scientific Computing Seminar Program conducted by Brookhaven National Lab.

Sayville Advanced Placement Chemistry teacher Melissa Dreyer has great praise for Michael's scientific acumen. "AP Chemistry is not for the average student as it is one of the most rigorous courses we offer at our school...it takes tremendous dedication and hard work to succeed. Michael willingly and enthusiastically took on this class as a tenth grader with no prior background in chemistry." Ms. Dreyer extolled Michael for his incredible gifts in science and his maturity which "sets him apart."

"Michael is a very conscientious student," Science Research Teacher Maria Brown concurs, "who is involved and performs well in and out of the classroom environment." Ms.

Brown along with many of Sayville faculty have described this remarkable young man as enthusiastic, helpful, diligent, humble, trustworthy, a role model and leader, with a great sense of humor, and who works well with others.

As one who can appreciate the science behind sports and music, Michael also enjoys the art of both. As a Varsity Bowler for the Sayville School team, which he joined as a seventh grader, he has maintained an average 207—his highest game was 279—and placed third in the SBBCA Doubles tournament. Michael has readily shown his musical prowess in Jazz Band, Wind Ensemble, Pep Band, Mid Island Band, and Brass Choir, competed in NYSSMA, and has been playing the Baritone Horn since fifth grade.

Michael's awards and honors include membership in both the Tri-M Music Honor Society and National Honor Society while his extracurricular activities include Robotics, SWEEP, Regional Quiz Bowl, Yearbook, and he has served as Senior Editor of the school newspaper, all this while also earning his Eagle Scout rank. Most recently, Michael was recognized at the 2017 Breakfast of Champions for being an essential component for a successful high school community.

There is no doubt; Michael Earvolino has earned his place as Valedictorian of the Class for his brilliant high school career. He plans to study Computer Science at Stony Brook University in the fall.

# Matthew Tomko - Class of 2017 Salutatorian

Matt won First Place for two consecutive years at Suffolk County Middle School Math Contest held at Brookhaven National Lab. So it is no wonder that High School Math teacher and Mathletes advisor Christopher Surrusco noted, "He is the most intuitive student that I have ever seen in Mathletes. He has consistently been the highest scorer on our Mathletes Team over the past four years.... without a doubt, Matt is the most naturally gifted math student I have had the pleasure to associate with in my thirty years teaching."

If math has been Matt's interest since childhood, music has been his passion since (before) birth. Born into a musically talented family—his mother is a music teacher, choral director and singer—Matt has inherited the proclivity for this talent. As a clarinetist, Matt played for Sayville High School Pit Orchestra, the High School Wind Ensemble, and for the Metropolitan Youth Orchestra Principal Orchestra. As an alto saxophonist Matt has performed with the High School Jazz Ensemble and the audition-based Nassau/Suffolk Jazz Ensemble. In addition, he has volunteered as a student-assistant teacher of clarinet and alto saxophone for the Sayville Summer Music Program. Taking electronic music in his Junior year helped Matt tap into his own creative energies and write an original composition entitled "Kickin" that was one of eleven electronic works to be featured at the 2016 NYSSMA All-State Conference.

High School newspaper advisor and English teacher Doug Shaw admitted knowing Matt first by reputation and then by Matt's school newspaper contributions. "It was not until this year," Mr. Shaw said, referring to Matt's enrollment in his AP Literature class, "that I had the pleasure of teaching him... Matt thinks on a level far beyond that of a typical, even exceptional high school student. He has a unique ability to see directly to the core of complex issues and articulate his knowledge with neither arrogance nor pretension.... In class discussions, Matt is not an aggressive participant. He seems to prefer to wait and listen to his classmates, and then thoughtfully respond to the discussion. It is very clear that Matt has earned both the respect and admiration of his classmates."

In Sayville, Matt has participated in extracurricular activities, including the State Champion Boys Varsity Golf and Varsity Bowling Teams, Mathletes, the school newspaper and Robotics Club. As a junior, he took math classes at Stony Brook as part of the Della Pietra High School Applied Math Program, and Saturday Advanced Math Classes at BNL through MoMath. Last summer, Matthew was one of fifty high school students selected to participate in Brookhaven National Lab's prestigious High School Research Program where he wrote programs for the Collider-Accelerator Department's website.

Coincidentally Class of 2017 Salutatorian Matthew Tomko has shared the same outstanding opportunities—Robotics, R.I.S.E., R.I.S.E. Tech, and Brookhaven Computer Science programs—with Class Valedictorian Michael Earvolino. It seems appropriate that Matt, too, has chosen to study Computer Science at Stony Brook in the fall.

Catch Me If You Can, the popular Leonardo DiCaprio and Tom Hanks movie—based upon the real life memoirs of Frank Abagnale, Jr.,— that became a Tony Award-winning Broadway musical comedy, touched down on the Sayville High School stage in spectacular style.


