Class of 2016 Valedictorian JARED BERGEN

With the highest weighted GPA of 108.327 among 224 students, Jaren Bergen has been named Sayville High School's Class of 2016 Valedictorian for his brilliant high school career.

Renowned for his insatiable thirst for knowledge, outstanding intelligence, and prodigious work ethic in all disciplines, Jared's talents have encompassed both the arts and sciences. He has spent the last four years in rigorous academic courses with a total of twelve AP classes—earning him an AP Scholar with Distinction designation—and ten Honors classes, including Scientific Research for four years with Research Teacher Maria Brown.

In addition to being a member of the *National Honor Society* for his high academic standing, Jared has participated in extracurricular activities such as *National History* Bowl, History Club, ModelUN, ACE Quiz Bowl, volunteers at his church and in the community, and buses part-time for a local restaurant.

Jared's scientific research project: Geospatial Analysis of Cetacean Distribution and Habitats has garnered many awards. At the Long Island Science & Engineering Fair

Class of 2016 Salutatorian EMILY SNEDDON

With the second highest weighted GPA of 106.833 among 224 students, Emily Sneddon has been named Sayville High School's Class of 2016 Salutatorian. Throughout her high school career, Emily has been a standout student, not just for her fiery red hair, but for the diversity of her interests, her drive to help others, and her ability to take charge.

Emily has achieved great academic success in twelve rigorous AP courses for which she earned AP *Scholar with Distinction*, and ten Honor classes that included three years of Art and four years of Science Research with Science Research teacher Maria Brown. She has been a National Merit Commended Student, a member of both the National Honor

Sciences category which qualified him to compete in the Intel International Science & Engineering Fair held in Phoenix, Arizona in early May. During that second competition against 1,760 students from seventy-seven nations, Jared's research project again earned high accolades, with Second *Place* in the Animal Sciences Division. At the Grand Awards Ceremony in Arizona, Jared won a scholarship and the privilege of having an asteroid named after him by NASA. Jared's project also earned the Irwin Wissner Conservation Award, the Ricoh Sustainable Development Award, and the Arizona State University Rob & Melani Walton Sustainability Solutions Initiatives Award.

A member of the Tri-M Music Society, Jared has been an accomplished percussionist in the High School Jazz Band, Pit Orchestra and Symphonic Orchestra, as well as a vocalist in the Jazz Choir and Chorale. Outside of school, he gives private lessons as a percussion instructor.

Jared's perceptive and strong writing abilities, demonstrated in AP Language and Composition class, has dovetailed well with his most consuming passion—social studies. Beyond the classroom, he has served as president of the History Club for two consecutive years, volunteered at the Sayville Historical Society, and has tirelessly assisted at the Town of Islip's Civil War Reenactments. To compete in the 2015 National History Day Project Competition, Jared teamed up with Emily Sneddon (Class of 2016 Salutatorian), and independent of any school activity, the two prepared for the competition in which they took *First Place* in New York State. With *History Club* teammates, Jared also took *First Place* in

(Intel Division) in March, he won *First Place* in the Animal selected Varsity Bracket for the 2015 National History Bowl Competition, and later, he received the 2015 Islip Town Board Student Achievement Award in the category of Social Studies.

> High School History Club advisor Susan Hart has the greatest praise for Jared's successful initiatives, most notably, the History Club Veteran's Breakfast. "As a result of his commitment to the Club and his academic standing in all social studies classes," Mrs. Hart stated, "Jared was nominated to the National History Club of Scholars and Rho *Kappa Honor Society....* Jared is truly a *budding* historian, but most importantly, an exemplary young man that has a bright future ahead."

> His future growing ever brighter, Jared has most recently been awarded the Annual Honorable Peter Fox Cohalan Scholarship (\$10,000 annually for four years) toward a degree completion in American History. He is the first Islip Town High School Senior to receive this award.

> Such accomplishments are not unexpected from someone who has achieved Valedictorian of the Class, but Jared's well-roundedness has been shaped by his sincere humility and compassion for others, which is a true testament of his character. Recognized at the 2015 Breakfast of Champions, Jared has been an essential component for a successful high school community as an infectious leader and a dynamic role model. He has been willing to raise his voice to warn of the fragility of whale populations in the northeast Atlantic Ocean and to help his peers both academically and personally. This winning combination will serve Jared well when he attends the College of William and Mary in the fall.

CURTAINS was entertaining with plot twists and turns that kept audiences guessing. 


