

#### TWO YEARS IN A ROW

Sayville received the NEW YORK STATE PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC Association Scholar-Athlete School OF DISTINCTION AWARD for the second straight year. There are over 750 member schools in the NYSPHSAA, and last year only 13 from the entire state received this award; five from Long Island (Massapequa, Jericho, Commack, Islip and Sayville). academic credentials, Amanda's deep and genuine concern for others, along with her endearing personal warmth and humor, have made her countless friends, befitting the definition of her name: "worthy of being loved."

Amanda's contributions and involvement in our High School's program have been multidimensional. Spanning several years of study through our Research and Science Engineering program, Amanda's culminating work at Brookhaven National Lab focused on the effect of a repeat variation in the human dopamine transporter gene on the dopaminergic brain system. In addition, Amanda co-authored two publications in other fields of research: an abstract submitted to Imaging Genetics Conference and a paper entitled Bivalve Characterization using Synchrotron Micro X-Ray Fluorescence.

Amanda is also an accomplished vocalist and thespian. As a member of the *Sayvillettes* (a girls' barbershop choral group), Jazz Choir, Chorale, and Sayville Players (last year as Mrs. Potts in *Beauty and the Beast* and this

year as Aunt Eller in *Oklahoma*), Amanda's performances have entertained us over the last four years.

Beyond her scientific research, scholarly publications, and musical talents, Amanda has served our High School—as a participant and often as a leader—with optimism and dedication in many of our community-service organizations such as the Site-Based Team, Anchor Club, SWEEP, Districtwide Wellness Committee, and School Business Advisory Board, among others.

Eagerly accepting every new challenge and commitment, Amanda continues to embrace new experiences (like zip lining in Costa Rica). A young woman with boundless potential, Amanda Rizzo, the Sayville High School Class of 2010 Valedictorian, can illuminate a room with her smile and leave one awestruck with her intellect. She aspires to pursue a degree in Biology with a concentration in pre-medicine, and plans to do so at Tufts University in the fall.

As with every year, the success of the SAVA show would not be possible without the hard work and dedication of the Art Department faculty and the amazing SAVA volunteers. Congratulations to all!








