

Beyond academics, Stephen has been a motivated Varsity Cross Country and Track athlete, who also participated in Intermural Soccer. In music, Stephen has played 1st Chair Tenor Saxophone for both Jazz Band and Jazz Ensemble, as well as Alto Saxophone for All-County Band and Tenor Sax for Mid-Island Band and also received both a SMBA Woodwind Award and Grant.


