## NJROTC /NNDCC HISTORY & PURPOSE



History: The NJROTC program was established by Public Law in 1964 and may be found in Title 10, U.S. Code, Chapter 102

- ➤ The program is conducted at accredited secondary schools throughout the nation.
- The Navy established a **Navy National Defense Cadet Corps** (NNDCC) program April 2011 and is offering the program to qualifying secondary educational institutions. (stepping stone for schools who do not currently meet NJROTC requirements)
- Facilitated by instructors who are retired Navy / Marine Corps Veterans (Officer & Senior Enlisted)
  - > Vetting process by way of a board held at Naval Service training Command (NSTC) Great Lakes, IL

## NJROTCs / NNDCCs ARE NOT RECRUITING PLATFORMS FOR THE MILITARY!!

## BENEFITS for School, Parents & Cadets



#### **Host School-**

- Community Service Hours: increased school community involvement.
- Suspensions: lower NJROTC /NDDCC suspensions (ISS/OSS) than national average.
- **Dropout rate:** fewer dropouts from NJROTC/NNDCC than national average.
- > GPA: NJROTC/NNDCC cadet higher versus Non-NJROTC/NNDCC cadet (4.0 Scale).
- > Average Daily Attendance: higher NJROTC/NNDCC cadet versus Non-NJROTC/NNDCC cadet.


#### **Cadets / Parents-**

- NNDCC encourages initiative, development of natural gifts, teaches self-control, and develops personal character, responsibility and qualities of integrity, leadership.
- Cadets who successfully complete 3 years of NNDCC are entitled to advanced promotion to pay grade E-3 upon initial enlistment in an active or reserve component of the Army, Navy, or Air Force, and pay grade E-2 in the Marine Corps.
- Free <u>SAT /ACT/College prep</u>-NNDCC cadets have access to <u>free</u> PSAT/SAT/ACT/college prep course
- <u>Scholarships</u> The scholarship opportunities for students are also plentiful.
- Navy Preparatory Program (NPP) opens access and prepares cadets to earn a commission for those who may not meet standardized test scores or have financial challenges that limit their ability to compete for NROTC scholarships.
- The Senior Naval Science Instructor is authorized to nominate three eligible cadets each year to compete for U.S. Naval Academy appointments as well as other service academies.

- Curriculum The curriculum in a NJROTC / NDCC program is generally broken down into four modules.
  - ➤ Naval Science 1 4

## **NAVAL SCIENCE 1 (NS1) (Freshmen)**

PURPOSE: To introduce students to the meaning of citizenship, the elements of followership, and the value of attaining life goals; promote an awareness first aid, geography and survival skills and an overview of Naval ships and aircraft. These elements are pursued at the fundamental level.

## **NAVAL SCIENCE 2 (NS 2) (Sophomore)**

PURPOSE: To build on the general introduction provided in Naval Science 1, to further develop the traits of citizenship and leadership, and to introduce cadets to the technical areas of naval science and the role of the U. S. Navy in maritime history and the vital importance of the world's oceans to the continued well-being of the United States.

## **NAVAL SCIENCE 3 (NS 3) (Junior)**

PURPOSE: Broaden the understanding of students in the operative principles of military leadership, the concept and significance of teamwork, the intrinsic value of good order and discipline. Students gain a more in-depth knowledge of Naval ships and aircraft and an introduction to marine navigation and seamanship

### NAVAL SCIENCE 4 (NS 4) (senior)

PURPOSE: Focused primarily on practical leadership techniques and implementation. The intent is to assist seniors in understanding leadership and improving their leadership skills by putting them in positions of leadership, under supervision.

## **NNDCC** is open to every student who meets the requirements:

- 1. Be enrolled in and attending a regular classes at the host school.
- 2. Be physically qualified to participate fully in the physical education program of the host school.
- 3. Be selected by the NJROTC instructor with the approval of the school principal or his/her representative.
- 4. Maintain good grades (at least 2.0)
- 5. Maintain acceptable standards of conduct. (You may be put on probation from participating in activities)
- 6. Comply with specified personal grooming standards.


