# NJROTC /NNDCC HISTORY & PURPOSE



**History:** The NJROTC program was established by Public Law in 1964 and may be found in Title 10, U.S. Code, Chapter 102

- The program is conducted at accredited secondary schools throughout the nation.
- The Navy established a **Navy National Defense Cadet Corps (NNDCC)** program April 2011 and is offering the program to qualifying secondary educational institutions. **(stepping stone for schools who do not currently meet NJROTC requirements)**
- Facilitated by instructors who are retired Navy / Marine Corps Veterans (Officer & Senior Enlisted)
  - Vetting process by way of a board held at Naval Service training Command (NSTC) Great Lakes, IL

## NJROTCs / NNDCCs ARE NOT RECRUITING PLATFORMS FOR THE MILITARY!!

### 1. Instill values of citizenship (strengthens our youth, communities, & our country)

- Community Service Hours
  - *Assisting local Veteran Chapters*

- Service Academy Appointments / ROTC Scholarships
- Pay grade of E-3 upon initial enlistment in active or reserve component.



# BENEFITS for School, Parents & Cadets



## Host School-

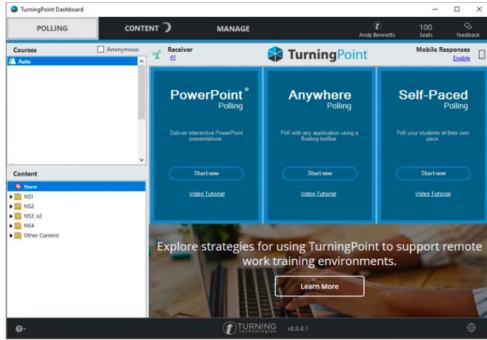
- **Community Service Hours:** increased school community involvement.
- **Suspensions:** lower NJROTC /NDDCC suspensions (ISS/OSS) than national average.
- **Dropout rate:** fewer dropouts from NJROTC/NNDCC than national average.
- **GPA:** NJROTC/NNDCC cadet higher versus Non-NJROTC/NNDCC cadet (4.0 Scale).
- **Average Daily Attendance:** higher NJROTC/NNDCC cadet versus Non-NJROTC/NNDCC cadet.

## Cadets / Parents-

- NNDCC encourages initiative, development of natural gifts, teaches self-control, and develops personal character, responsibility and qualities of integrity, leadership.
- Cadets who successfully complete 3 years of NNDCC are entitled to advanced promotion to pay grade E-3 upon initial enlistment in an active or reserve component of the Army, Navy, or Air Force, and pay grade E-2 in the Marine Corps.
- **Free SAT /ACT/College prep**-NNDCC cadets have access to free PSAT/SAT/ACT/college prep course
- **Scholarships** - The scholarship opportunities for students are also plentiful.
- **Navy Preparatory Program (NPP)** - opens access and prepares cadets to earn a commission for those who may not meet standardized test scores or have financial challenges that limit their ability to compete for NROTC scholarships.
- The Senior Naval Science Instructor is authorized to nominate three eligible cadets each year to compete for U.S. Naval Academy appointments as well as other service academies.

# COURSE STRUCTURE



## Full Credit Elective

- Curriculum- The curriculum in a NJROTC / NDCC program is generally broken down into four modules.
  - Naval Science 1 – 4

### NAVAL SCIENCE 1 (NS1) (Freshmen)

PURPOSE: To introduce students to the meaning of citizenship, the elements of followership, and the value of attaining life goals; promote an awareness first aid, geography and survival skills and an overview of Naval ships and aircraft. These elements are pursued at the fundamental level.

### NAVAL SCIENCE 2 (NS 2) (Sophomore)

PURPOSE: To build on the general introduction provided in Naval Science 1, to further develop the traits of citizenship and leadership, and to introduce cadets to the technical areas of naval science and the role of the U. S. Navy in maritime history and the vital importance of the world's oceans to the continued well-being of the United States.

### NAVAL SCIENCE 3 (NS 3) (Junior)

PURPOSE: Broaden the understanding of students in the operative principles of military leadership, the concept and significance of teamwork, the intrinsic value of good order and discipline. Students gain a more in-depth knowledge of Naval ships and aircraft and an introduction to marine navigation and seamanship

### NAVAL SCIENCE 4 (NS 4) (senior)

PURPOSE: Focused primarily on practical leadership techniques and implementation. The intent is to assist seniors in understanding leadership and improving their leadership skills by putting them in positions of leadership, under supervision.

## NNDCC is open to every student who meets the requirements:

1. Be enrolled in and attending a regular classes at the host school.
2. Be physically qualified to participate fully in the physical education program of the host school.
3. Be selected by the NJROTC instructor with the approval of the school principal or his/her representative.
4. Maintain good grades (at least 2.0)
5. Maintain acceptable standards of conduct. (You may be put on probation from participating in activities)
6. Comply with specified personal grooming standards.





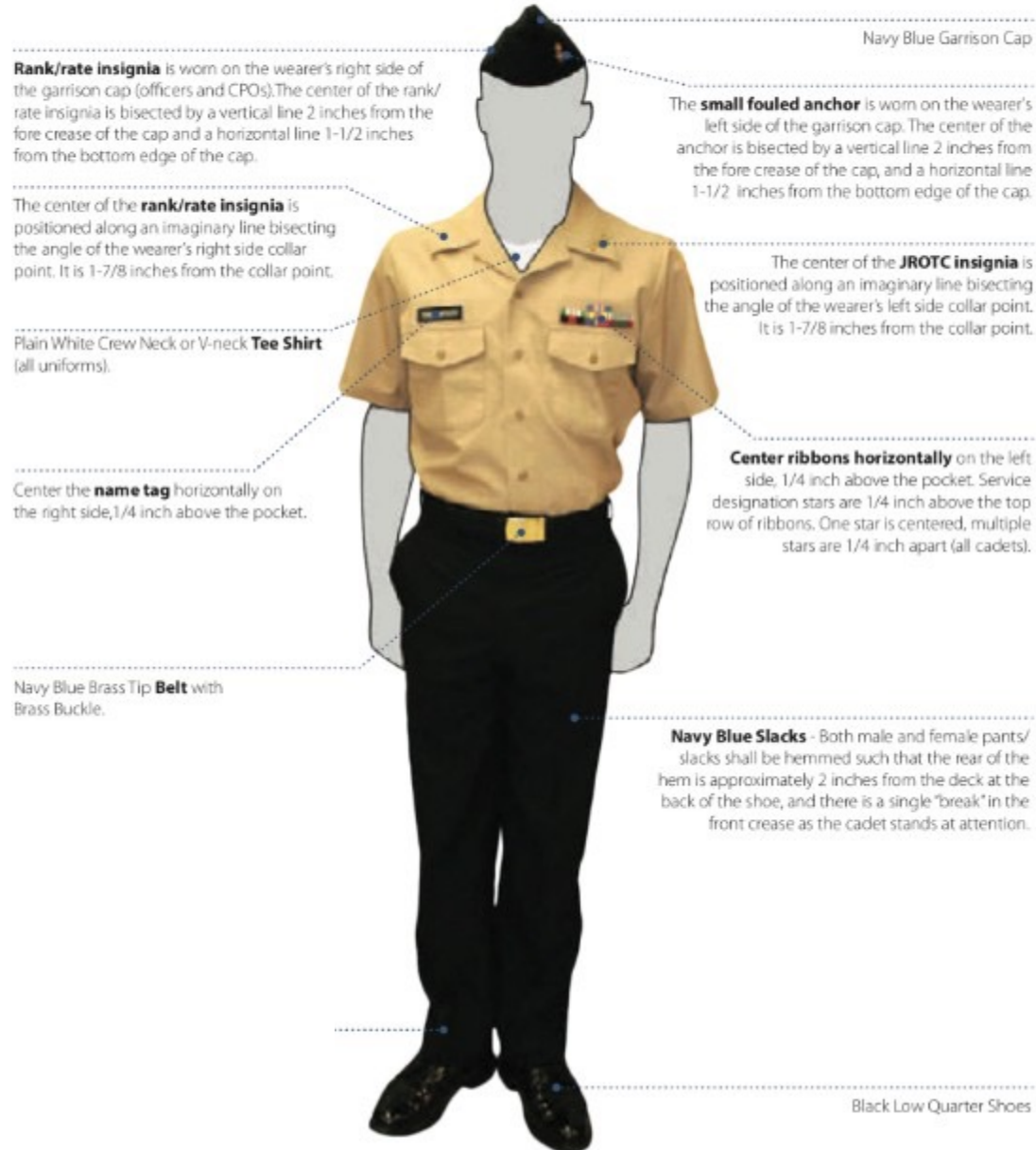
## What is expected of our cadets?

## Navy Service Uniform



**Rank/rate insignia** is worn on the wearer's right side of the garrison cap (officers and CPOs). The center of the rank/rate insignia is bisected by a vertical line 2 inches from the fore crease of the cap and a horizontal line 1-1/2 inches from the bottom edge of the cap.

The center of the **rank/rate insignia** is positioned along an imaginary line bisecting the angle of the wearer's right side collar point. It is 1-7/8 inches from the collar point.

Center the **name tag** horizontally over the front seam on the right side, 6-1/4 inches down from the intersection of the front and shoulder seams.

Plain White Crew Neck or V-neck **Tee Shirt** (all uniforms).

**Navy Blue Slacks** - Both male and female pants/slacks shall be hemmed such that the rear of the hem is approximately 2 inches from the deck at the back of the shoe, and there is a single "break" in the front crease as the cadet stands at attention.

Black Socks



Navy Blue Garrison Cap

The **small fouled anchor** is worn on the wearer's left side of the garrison cap. The center of the anchor is bisected by a vertical line 2 inches from the fore crease of the cap, and a horizontal line 1-1/2 inches from the bottom edge of the cap.

The center of the **JROTC insignia** is positioned along an imaginary line bisecting the angle of the wearer's left side collar point. It is 1-7/8 inches from the collar point.

**Center ribbons horizontally** over the front seam on the left side, 6-1/4 inches down from the intersection of the front and shoulder seams. Service designation stars are 1/4 inch above the top row of ribbons. One star is centered, multiple stars are 1/4 inch apart (all cadets).
