About Us: FINANCES




- GFPS has been a stable and well-managed public school district since it was created in 1888.
 - Excellent track record of clean audits
- State law creates a range (minimum and maximum budget) for all schools. The State funding formula is based mainly on student enrollment
 - In order to increase the General Fund Budget(s), the voters must approve the amount of the increase in the form of a mill levy election. The amount cannot exceed the maximum budget.
- Combined General Fund budgets of \$74.798 million (Fy2020)
 - Elementary General Fund Levy approval of \$1,750,000 mill levy in May 2020
- Based on the 2020-21 budget, the maximum amount the district could request this spring is \$266,393

About Us: FINANCES



- Over 70% of the General Fund Budget is directly related to classroom teacher salaries and supplies
- Approximately 13% of the budget is used for heating, electricity and building maintenance
- 6% of the budget is used for Building Administration including secretarial costs and building supplies
- About 3% of the budget is spent on insurance, elections, postage, audits, dues and fees
- Just over 3% of the budget is used for the business functions of the District (Payroll, Purchasing, Accounts Payable, and Warehouse operations)
