Benefits for college Scholars

Extended period of time to acquire skill in all areas for the school and to recognize the complex organization that it is.

Ensures the highest quality mentor teachers who make cross-curricular connections, use evidence-based math and literacy practices, engage students in authentic problem-solving, and hands-on, project based learning.

Learning will have real time application, embedded opportunities for structured reflection.

Shortened period of time to complete degree, but with the same level of rigor.

Sprint Degree

The MUS Sprint Degree that the Division of Education at UMW would like to pursue is a three-year accelerated program that leads to a BS: Elementary Education. The design of the program is as follows:

First Summer or through Dual Enrollment: 9-12 credits

Gen Ed 1 - Behavioral/Social Science, 3-4 Credits (through UMW or GFC)

Gen Ed 2 - WRIT 101, 3-4 Credits (through UMW or GFC)


EDU 201 - Introduction to Education With Field Experience, 3-4 Credits


First Fall: 11-12 Credits—Writing intensive semester

GFPS CORE SCHOOL - BIG SCHOLARS

Help us get to know you! The GFPS partnership with University of Montana Western is seeking 10-14 students for the first CORE school cohort of future elementary teachers. What does this look like? If selected:

- · You would be able to earn a paycheck by being employed as a paraeducator with GFPS during the school day.
- · You would be able to receive tuition waivers to make college extremely low cost.
- You would be able to complete a Bachelor's of Science sprint degree in Elementary Education in three years (including summers).
- · Your education specific courses will be taught at the CORE school as part of the school day.
- You can choose to take your additional courses online through UMW or locally through GFC-MSU.
- You will remain with a cohort group of other college students who will support and work with you as you earn your degree.
