8.B.2. Consider taking action to suspend the District's restriction against the presence and consumption of alcohol on district grounds, specifically for the six homes located in the Teacher Village at Taylor Hicks, as presented.

RELEVANT INFORMATION:

According to Governing Board Policy BGF - Suspension/Repeal of Policy, the Governing Board has the authority to temporarily or permanently suspend by a majority vote the operation of any section or sections of Board policies not established and required by last or vested by contract. Legal counsel has stated that the Governing Board has the authority to temporarily suspend the restriction regarding alcohol, but that the "No Tobacco" policy must be enforced and cannot be waived.

Presenter: Clark Tenney, Superintendent shared the following information with Governing Board members:

For the limited alcohol waiver in our Teacher Village, you will be asked to vote to apply Board policy BGF (ability to waive Board policies). In so doing, you would waive some limited applications of Board policies KFA, GBECB, and GBECA (prohibitions of possession/use of alcohol on school campuses), according to the wording below. As you recall, the IGA with the City of Prescott regarding the Teacher Village references both an alcohol restriction and possible limited Board waiver of this restriction for all Teacher Village residents. This IGA has been approved by both City and PUSD attorneys. The wording below has been specifically vetted by PUSD's attorney Mr. Paoule, and includes his recommended wording.

Tenants recognize that by state law, "Tobacco products are prohibited on school grounds, inside school buildings, in school parking lots or playing fields." (ARS36-798.03) Tenant also recognizes that "Possession or use of marijuana, peyote, dangerous drugs or narcotic drugs in a drug free school zone" is prohibited and punishable by law (ARS 13-3411).

Tenants further recognize that the possession and/or use of alcohol on school campuses is strictly prohibited. Tenants shall never allow or tolerate underage drinking. Neither Tenant nor Tenant's guest(s) shall exhibit or consume alcohol outside the unit unless all the following conditions are met: the exhibition or consumption occurs (1) within the fenced area of the Teacher Village, (2) between the hours of 5pm and midnight, and (3) no school-or city-sponsored activity is being held on the school campus (includes events both inside school buildings and outside on the school fields).
