

Annual Report for the Legacy Fund for the Walker Natatorium

PURPOSE OF THE ENDOWMENT

The Earl E. and Myrtle E. Walker Foundation grant to build the Walker Natatorium at Kirkwood High School was an unprecedented act of generosity for our community. The Legacy Fund was established to maintain the aquatic facility for generations of Pioneers to use for instruction and competition. Earnings from the endowment are given to the Kirkwood School District to help maintain the pool.

NEW IN 2021-2022

In March of 2022 the Foundation was able to showcase the Walker Natatorium with a new event called "Splash Expo". Splash Expo brought Kirkwood families together to celebrate all facets of what the Walker Natatorium offers our students with a bit of whimsy and a lot of fun.

Kirkwood schools from KECC to KHS nominated dedicated teachers & principals to participate in our "Pioneer Plunge". Our KSD staff took cannonballs to a new level, proving to be inspirational in both their school and the pool! Notably we were in awe of Keysor teacher, Jeff Capizzi, who is not only an impressive diver but also an ocean swimmer who regularly jumps cliffs and swims with sharks!

KHS swim & dive teams also made a splash with exciting swim relays and impressive dive exhibitions.





Kirkwood is fortunate to have a world-class facility like the Walker Natatorium. We are grateful to the Walker Family and our Legacy Fund donors for their generosity. Our goal is to fund this pool in perpetuity by reaching the \$3M mark for our endowed fund. In September of 2021, The Kirkwood School District Foundation also hired its first Executive Director, Stephanie Collet. One of Stephanie's long-term goals is to bring our legacy fund to a self-sustaining level.

ENDOWMENT MANAGEMENT

The Legacy Fund continues to be managed by Morgan Stanley towards safety, income, and inflation protection with approximately 55% in fixed income, preferred and alternatives, & equities representing 45%. The fund returned 8.07% in 2021 with an average annual return of 5.84%. Our Investment Committee reviews all holdings monthly, has quarterly updates, and annual presentations. During the 4th quarter of 2021 with volatility increasing we moved our 2022 district payment into a money market.
