The Board of Trustees and Superintendent or designee have developed the following protocol for determination of allowing students and student athletes to participate in outdoor activities when Air Quality Restrictions have reached the Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups or higher categories as indicated on the DEQ guidelines.

- 1. The Great Falls Public School District shall use the Montana DEQ health effect categories to determine the air quality for the District.
- 2. The following personnel shall make the decision to hold or cancel outdoor activities, practices, or contests:
 - a. Recess Assistant Superintendent for TK-6
 - b. Middle School practices Athletic Director
 - c. Middle School contests Athletic Director
 - d. High School practices Athletic Director
 - e. High School contests Athletic Director
 - f. All outdoor activities Superintendent or designee
- 3. Cancellation of activities is evaluated hourly by district personnel. District personnel will attempt to provide advanced notice of event cancellation to accommodate the travel plans of GFPS families/coaches as well as guests traveling to GFPS to participate.
- 4. The notice to hold or cancel an outdoor activity shall be communicated to:
 - a. Students through school officials.
 - b. Staff through school communication tools.
 - c. Coaches through the Athletic Director.
 - d. Parents through Blackboard and District social media sites.
 - e. Community through District social media sites.
