


# **18-19 GENERAL FUND**

- The <u>General Fund</u> pays for:
  - Educational & instructional opportunities
    - Includes general maintenance and operational costs
    - Does not include grant monies nor federal allocations.
- Trustees' duty to approve a balanced GENERAL FUND BUDGET that balances:
  - High quality educational opportunities, while
  - Maximizing efficiency and accountability.
- The BOND LEVY proceeds CANNOT be used to fund instructional and operational costs.

# HOW DO WE BUDGET?

- Use the current budget as the basis to calculate the new budget:
- Determine estimated expenditures
- Determine estimated revenues
- Compare
- Determine necessary action(s) to balance
- Adopt a budget in August

### 2018-2019 Budget Projections:




## **OPTIONS:**

## 1. An Operational Levy up to \$1,349,048 (over BASE maximum)

- •AND Reduce \$216,315
- AND D4A of \$156,345 from reserves

## 2. No Levy:

- Reductions of \$1,565,363
- AND D4A of \$156,345 from reserves



## Trustees Voted to Fulfill Their Oath of Office

- February 22, 2018; Unanimous decision
- Montana Constitution. Article X, Section 1, (1):
  - It is the goal of the people to establish a system of education which will develop the <u>full educational potential of each person</u>.
     <u>Equality of educational opportunity is</u> <u>guaranteed</u> to each person of the state.
- By design, the funding for public education is linked to taxes and therefore to levies.

## **Property Tax Relief Available**

- Property Tax Assistance Application
  - Own and occupy your home for at least 7 months of the year
  - Based on Federal Adjusted Gross Income:
    - Single: \$21,607
    - Married: \$28,810
- Elderly Homeowner/Renter Credit Application (2EC)
  - 62 years or older
  - Occupied for 6 months (own or rent)
  - Reside in Montana for 9 months
  - Gross household income less than \$45,000
  - Refundable credit up to \$1000

 <u>Maintain</u> the educational opportunities Great Falls is known for.




## **Equality of Educational Opportunity?**

#### Per Student Expenditures




K-8 & High School Average of All Budgeted Funds

# Regardless, still have to reduce \$216,315

- •Cost shifts to outside agencies
- Admin/Supervisor staff position changes
- •Staff reductions (8 FTE: library, English, math, HPE, MS Related Arts)

## Without the levy...



### More and serious reductions of GF expenditures! \$1,565,363 worth of...

Inclusive of the previous \$216,315...

Administration	\$ 35 <i>,</i> 000
Classified Support Staff	\$ 103,745
Professional/Teaching Staff	\$ 743,193
Shifts to Other Sources	\$ 492,000
10% HS Budget	\$ 80,000
Supplies	\$ 111,425
Total	\$1,565,363

- 1 less supervisor position: duties reassigned
  - 6 people
  - \*13 people
  - 2 people; special ed \$; Foundation; year-end

\*Includes a program elimination:

Environmental Hands-On Educational Program

Also reduces Gifted (ECS) Education Teacher Staffing (5 staff to 3)



  - 2 Assistant Superintendents, Business Director, HR Director, Federal/Special Ed Director, Technology Director
- 28 Principals and Associate Principals:
  - 15 elementary; 2 middle school principals, 2 middle school associate principals, 2 high school principals, 1 high school/adult education principal, 6 high school associate principals
- 6 Supervisors:
  - Food Service & Assistant, Buildings/Grounds & Assistant, Data Processing, Print Center
- 9 Coordinators:
  - Preschool, Title 1, Special Education (2), Curriculum (2), HPE & Athletics, Music/Art, Indian Education
