Welcome to the Publications Department at C.M. Russell High School. Adviser Beth Britton leads two strong teams of journalists, who produce the monthly *Stampede* newspaper, the annual *Russellog* yearbook, and the web site www.rustlernews.com.

CLASSES

Introduction to Journalism: This full-year course prepares students to join the yearbook and/or the newspaper staff. No pre-requisite or application is required. The class is open to all grade levels. Topics covered include: The First Amendment, journalism ethics, journalistic writing, opinion writing, advertising, publications design and digital photography.

Yearbook Workshop: This full-year course is comprised of students who spend the year designing and assembling the full-color, 288-page *Russellog*. The class is open to grades 10-12. (freshmen with special permission) Students are admitted to the class by an application and interview process. Students are graded on deadline performance and portfolios consisting of the year's work.

Newspaper Workshop: This full-year course is comprised of students responsible for the publication of the monthly *Stampede* newspaper and the graduation magazine – as well as the maintenance of the web site, www.rustlernews.com. The class is open to grades 10-12. (freshmen with special permission) Students are admitted to the class by an application and interview process. Students are graded on deadline performance and portfolios consisting of the year's work.

Students in all classes learn writing skills, design techniques, organization and time management, advertising sales and design, editing skills, teamwork and communication.



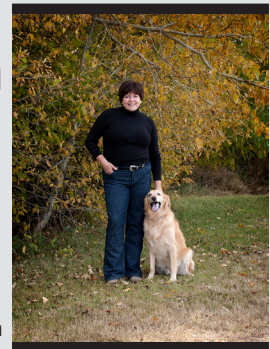
