





Students who graduate from a designated A+ high school may qualify for a state-paid financial incentive to attend any public community college or career/technical school in Missouri. Must meet criteria:

- -Grades (min 2.5 cum GPA)
- -Attendance (95% rate after 4 years ~approximately 36 total days)
- -50 hours of unpaid approved tutoring/mentoring

- -Proficient/Advanced on Algebra End-Of-Course Exam
- -Signed A+ contract

AP COURSES vs. DUAL CREDIT COURSES

The chart below was created to help students and families make decisions about taking an AP Course versus a dual enrollment course.

| | Advanced Placement(AP) | <u>Dual Credit</u> |
|--------------------------------------|---|---|
| Description | The AP Program allows students to take college-level exams, and potentially earn college credit or placement while still earning high school credits. | Dual Credit classes allow high school students to earn both high school and college credit by completing college courses at their high school. |
| Credit | College credit is earned when students pass the AP examination administered globally by the College Board. Individual colleges and universities grant credit based on their own minimum scores. | Credit is awarded by the partner university (Missouri State, University of Missouri St. Louis, STLCC) and their student letter grade is given by their high school teacher of record. The credit and grade is included on the college transcript when complete. |
| Teachers/ Curriculum | The course is taught by high school faculty using the rigorous curriculum provided by AP. | Dual credit courses are taught by high school teachers who also serve as adjunct college instructors using the curriculum approved by the university. |
| College /University Acceptance | Credit is accepted by many colleges and universities. Credit typically requires a score of 3 or higher out of a total of 5 on the exam. Verify with specific schools to be certain. | Dual credit classes transfer to most public colleges and universities in MO. Verify with specific schools to be certain. |
| Eligibility | Open to any students who take an AP class at KHS. | Open to any students who meet the prerequisites set by the partner university, including minimum GPA, and possible recommended ACT scores |
| Cost | The costs of AP exams are incurred by the student. Subsidies may be available for students demonstrating financial need. The 2024 expected exam rate is \$98 | Students are responsible for tuition at the rate set by the partner university. The rate is typically much less than the on-campus rate per credit hour. |


