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



Bowling Green City Schools March 31, 2024





Summary Analysis:

For the month of March, Revenue was 16% lower than March of last year, while Expenditures were 2% higher. Some months are expected to be higher or lower than others, due to the timing of many operational aspects in both revenue and expenditures that only occur annually or quarterly. Real Property tax collections caused the majority of the spike in revenue this month. We will continue to track both levels through the fiscal year to assist with fiscally responsible operational decisions.

In the graph above, expenditures were higher than revenue from August until February. Revenue is currently trending higher, but because tax collections only occur twice per year the trend is not expected to continue throughout the remainder of this fiscal year. Overall expenditures have been outpacing revenue in the current fiscal year.

The Treasurer recommends a proactive approach in identifying and addressing any potential changes that are needed in order to provide an equitable education for all students and consistent operations for the District. Evaluating the trends of financial data will help to identify those challenges.
