





→ Your Teachers

- ◆ First point of contact for questions about classwork, grades and assignments
- ◆ Be sure to join the Google classroom for each class



Pre-Capstone/ AP Capstone Track

Are you interested in a high level of academic challenge and aiming for competitive college admissions?

The AP Capstone Program is administered in collaboration with the College Board. It provides a selection of rigorous and challenging face to face classes designed to introduce students to college level work. There is a particular focus on research and writing skills that are essential for success in college. Students may earn college credit for their course work depending upon the scores received on the AP exam for the course. Students in the Capstone Program will take the AP Capstone Research and Seminar courses plus four additional AP courses that align with their college aspirations.

Important Consideration:

AP coursework is highly respected in college admissions offices. Successful completion of AP coursework demonstrates a readiness for college level work that is viewed favorably in admissions considerations.





What is Pre-Capstone?

The Pre-Capstone course pathway enables you to complete prerequisite courses for AP classes in your 9th and 10 grade years and begin some AP course work in 9th and 10 grade as well.

What courses would a Pre-Capstone student typically complete in 9th and 10th grade?

- Math 1, 2 and 3
- Earth & Environmental Science, Biology and possibly Chemistry
- At least 2 units of a foreign language
- Computer Science (for students with a STEM focus)
- At least one AP course, such as AP World History, AP Psychology or AP Environmental Science

Career & College Promise/Associates Degree Track

Would you like to earn and many college credits as possible or even earn an Associates Degree while in High School?

Through North Carolina's Career and College Promise (CCP) Program, juniors and seniors with a qualifying GPA can take college courses through Wilson Community College. These courses are offered tuition free and motivated students can complete enough courses to complete an Associates Degree while in high school. College credits will transfer to public universities within the UNC system and will transfer to many other colleges and universities as well. It is also possible to earn a certificate in Welding Technology, Electrical Systems technology and Medical Office Administration.

Important Consideration:

Many CCP courses are offered online, so students in this track need to demonstrate a high level of initiative & self-motivation.





Arts & Performance Track

Students may delve into performance and visual arts throughout their high school career. These programs provide opportunities to compete with other high school students across the country and provide leadership opportunities for students as well.

JROTC Leadership Development Track

Do you want to develop your leadership potential and learn about citizenship, civic engagement and military service?

Students may participate in the Air Force JROTC program throughout their four years at Hunt. This program provides outstanding mentoring and technical, leadership, civic and wellness programming. There are many opportunities for students to engage in extracurricular activities and to compete with students in other JROTC programs.

Important consideration:

Students do not need to intend to join the military to participate in JROTC, but students who ultimately do enlist may enter the military at a higher rank due to their JROTC participation.



Career and Technical Education Track

Students who enroll in Career and Technical Education courses develop valuable job skills and employment qualifications while in high school. These courses also provide an opportunity for students to explore content that interests them most and to benefit from hands on learning opportunities. Course options include Horticulture, Animal Science, Agricultural Mechanics, Microsoft Office, Foods, Parenting, Marketing, Hospitality and Tourism, Business Law, Digital Design and Animation, Health Science and Computer Science.

Important Consideration:

CTE courses can be very useful for both college bound students and students who intend to enter the workforce upon graduation.

AVID Leadership & College Preparation Track

Do you want to develop your leadership & academic skills and become prepared for the college admissions process?
