



School Days

In the School Days project, your child will learn about their own school and locality, both today and in the past. They will compare schooling in the Victorian era to their experiences today. They will learn about objects found in a Victorian classroom and how they were used. They will research Samuel Wilderspin, an important figure in the development of schooling for young children in the Victorian era, whose ideals are reflected in schooling today. They will learn to describe the passage of time through study of past, present and future tense vocabulary.

Maths	White Rose Maths Summer units – multiplication and division, fractions, position and direction and place value and money.
English	Writing and reading skills based on the book Whiffy Wilson the Wolf who Wouldn't go to School and Diary of a Killer Cat. Poetry based on Poems to Perform. Focusing on capital letters, full stops and complex sentences using 'and' 'or' and 'but.'
Science	Plant Parts-This project teaches children about wild and garden plants by exploring the local environment. They identify and describe the basic parts of plants and observe how they change over time. Animal Parts-This project teaches children about animals, including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds, mammals and invertebrates. They identify and describe their common structures, diets, and how animals should be cared for.
History	This project teaches children about their own school and locality, both today and in the past. They compare schooling in the Victorian era to their experiences today. Historical vocabulary; Historical artefacts; Timelines; Present day schools; Our school; Victorian era; Victorian schools; Significant people – Samuel Wilderspin
Art/DT	Chop, slice and mash-This project teaches children about sources of food and the preparatory skills of peeling, tearing, slicing, chopping, mashing and grating. They use this knowledge and techniques to design and make a supermarket sandwich according to specific design criteria. Street View-This project teaches children about artwork depicting streets and buildings and focuses on the work of the American pop artist, James Rizzi. They create a 3-D mural based on Rizzi's work.
