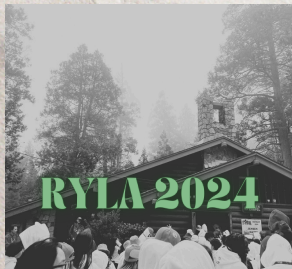

# Trump's Trial

If you have been keeping up with former President Donald Trump's legal problems, you know that on April 4th, he was indicted by a grand jury in New York.

### What is an Indictment?

Indictment is defined as an official accusation stating that a person is being charged with a crime and that a criminal trial will be held. What's the difference between that and being charged with a crime? Well, being charged means a state or federal prosecutor filed charges against you.

### What Happened?

In 2016, Trump was accused of paying hush-money to an adult-film star. This was because there was an alleged affair between Trump and Stormy Daniels in 2006, which he denies. He was indicted for taking classified national defense documents from the White House after he left office and resisting the government's attempts to retrieve the materials from his house in Florida. Additionally, an investigation was

Trump and his allies "attempted to exploit the violence and chaos at the Capitol by calling lawmakers to convince them ... to delay the certification" (CNN Politics) In the county of Fulton and state of Georgia, Trump is being indicted on behalf of Fani Willis on meddling in the U.S. presidential election of 2020.

### Next Step...

The trial for the hush money was on April 15, 2024. The trial for the classified documents found in the Mar-a-Lago home is set for May 2024. The trial for Trump's involvement of the election in 2020 has not been set and is to be determined. The date has not been set for the Fulton County trial but should take place within the next few years.

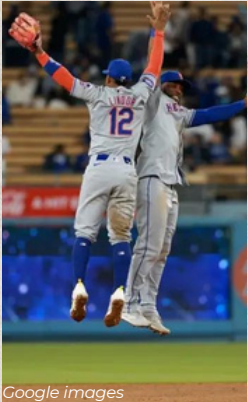

It's the go to spot for many Riverside residents seeking to cook and pig out on a delicious all you can eat selection of meats. However, there exists a lesser-known spot where one can also indulge on the full Korean BBQ experience. Enter Koreana Grill—found right off of Magnolia almost across from Tyler Mall. I mentioned that this place is underrated, and it is. I went with a group of friends after a tennis match and, while most were familiar with Korean BBQ and Wang Cho, the majority had never been to Koreana before (myself included).

However, I've got to say, for its size, Koreana provides an amazing for you Korean BBQ enjoyers. The dinner price is \$30.00 for all you can eat, putting it at a cheaper price than its competitor, Wang Cho. I'd say the highlights are the Beef Brisket and Beef Bulgogi (pictured to the right). There's also an expansive list of side dishes that come free with all you can eat! 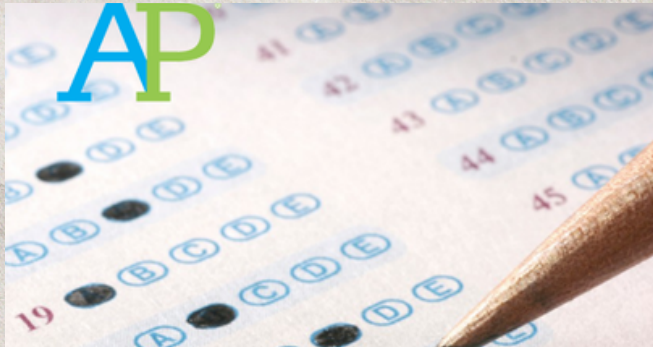

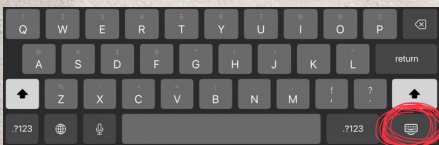

# Tech Tips

Did you know that you can change the layout of your keyboard for an easier typing experience?

1. When typing, hold on the keyboard icon in the bottom right.



2. You will receive multiple options for displaying your keyboard, notably "split."

Clicking on it will split the keyboard in half to allow for a more relaxed typing position.



3. To revert your keyboard back to normal, bring up the options by repeating Step 1 and clicking "Dock and Merge"

- Bringing up different options might require you to zoom in on the keyboard to revert it back to normal.

4. Additionally, other options like undock will allow you to adjust the position of the full keyboard by holding and moving the keyboard icon. Selecting the floating option will turn the keyboard into a small box making it easy to move around for multitasking.



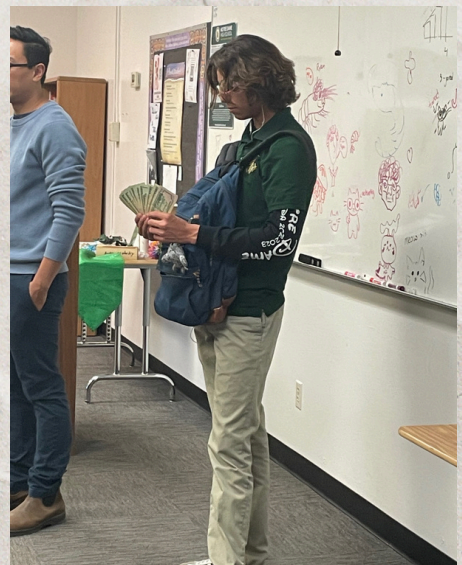
